The New Year began sadly and solemnly with the funeral for NYPD Hero P.O. Wenjian Liu, on January 4. The dangers of police work reared it's ugly head again the following day with the shooting of 46 precinct officers Andrew Dossi and Aliro Pellerano, after they confronted two robbery suspects.

Unfortunately more sad news continued throughout the month.

On January 5, I received an email from Jeanne Woods, wife of Club member, retired NYPD Lt. Thomas Woods, notifying me that Tom had passed away on Oct. 5, 2014. A previous email sent a few days after Tom's death, was sent to an email address that I have not used in over 5 years. Tom had been a member of our Club since 2008 and even though he lived 160+ miles from Charlotte and only 17 miles from Raleigh, he remained a member of our Club after a 10-13 Club was formed in Raleigh.

During the week of January 19, two Club members who had been diagnosed with 9/11 related cancers received bad news. Ret. NYPD Det. Al Sheppard had tests done to see if his cancer could be treated with the removal of his lung. Unfortunately the cancer had metastasized and spread to other parts of his body, including his brain.

Ret. NYPD Capt. Ed McGreal had prostate surgery and learned that the cancer had spread outside of the prostate to the seminal vesicles, which only occurs in about 3-7% of men with the disease. When he was diagnosed with the disease he was told that he has had the cancer for a long time. Ed, who is only 50 years old will be undergoing 6 weeks of radiation treatment in hopes of slowing the spread of the disease.

Please note that prostate cancer is a slowly developing cancer that can go undetected for many years, If diagnosed early, it can be effectively treated. Though the American Cancer Society recommends that men over the age of 50 undergo a yearly digital rectal examination and PSA testing, please have the tests done if you are younger than 50 and were part of the 9/11 WTC rescue or clean-up effort. This can prevent the misfortune that has befallen Ed.

Please keep AI and Ed in your thoughts and prayers along with Club member Paul Johnson who is suffering from a debilitating respiratory 9/11 related illness.

The final item of bad news occurred on January 27 with the passing of former Club Trustee Jim Houston. Jim was an integral part of our Club and diligently served as a Trustee from January 2011 to January 2014 when his cancer made it difficult to continue to do so.

Jim assisted and participated in all Club events. He coordinated our program to collect snacks and toiletries that were sent to Armed Services personnel serving in the middle east. He spearheaded our effort to provide gift cards, during the holidays, to members of the Camp Lejeune Marine Corps Wounded Warrior Battalion. When the task of ordering and distributing Club shirts became too burdensome for me, Jim volunteered to take on the task. (Continued next page)......

CEA CONDEMNS UNPROVOKED ATTACK ON UNIFORMED POLICE INSPECTOR AND DE-MANDS FULL PROSECUTION AND JAIL TIME FOR ATTACKER

Police Inspector Andrew Capul, while policing an otherwise peaceful demonstration in Harlem, was approached from the rear by a career violent felon and violently punched in the head causing the Police Inspector serious injury.

Inspector Capul was not attacked because of the color of his skin, he was targeted because he wore a "blue" uniform. We demand District Attorney Vance prosecute the perpetrator of this attack fully and put him behind jail bars where he belongs.

There is a nationwide discussion of social issues occurring that has very loud voices speaking on all sides. Demonstration organizers have a responsibility to their community to conduct themselves peace-fully and express disdain for people and words that advocate violence.

Police Officers put their lives on the line every day they come to work. We have an obligation to our family to come home to them safely. Dear LBA Member:

I just wanted to update you regarding enhancements to the SOC Health and Welfare Fund's Prescription and Optical benefits which took effect as of January 1, 2015.

The annual family deductible for the SOC Prescription Plan is now \$50 a year; this is a \$25 reduction from last year, and a \$100 reduction from four years ago. This cost saving for our members was made possible due to the overall reengineering of our prescription plan to a predominantly generic based plan.

Retirees, and their spouses, are **now entitled to an annual optical benefit**. In the past this benefit was only available every two years. Dependent children are still eligible for the optical benefit every year.

We, in cooperation with the SOC Health and Welfare Fund, constantly strive to identify ways to enhance our members' benefits. This has resulted in the cost savings mentioned while maintaining the quality of benefits our members' deserve.

S.B.A. President Ed Mullins Letter to the 'The Chief' re: The Department of Investigation Threat to Lock Up NYPD Police Officers For Using a Chokehold

Dear Editor:

Apparently, there is yet another sheriff in Town.

Your article dated January 16,2015, entitled "001 Commissioner: We'll Intervene If NYPD Doesn't Address Chokeholds" contains an entirely gratuitous statement from Commissioner Mark G. Peters of the Department of Investigations wherein he threatens to arrest members of the NYPD if they, in his estimation, "violated the Penal Code of the State of New York".

This misguided threat from a Commissioner who has pronounced himself the final arbiter of what constitutes a crime in the City - despite the existence of the duly-elected District Attorneys who serve in that capacity - does nothing but further demoralize the women and men who protect the citizenry, and detracts from the important, on-going and productive dialogue regarding the state of policing in the City.

We do not share Mr. Peters' view, publicly declared, that his intervention is warranted. The report generated by his office, which is the basis for his decree - a report in which his Department reviewed case files generated by other agencies but takes no firsthand action to meet with witnesses or confirm the conclusions reached by other investigators - concludes that the NYPD disciplinary process is "historically" (defined in his report as "since 2009") recalcitrant in punishing officers who allegely employed a "chokehold" during the course of an arrest. If improvements are not made, he claims, he will intervene and arrest.

What Commissioner Peters ignores is that the "substantiated" allegations upon which he makes his threat are subject to review by other agencies, including the newly-formed Administrative Prosecution Unit of CCRB. Of the ten substantiated cases out of 1022 complaints to CCRB (thus, 1012 were not "substantiated") which constitute the universe (his word) of cases reviewed, APU has taken one "chokehold" case to trial - and lost. One other chokehold case was dismissed by APU, and one is pending. The remaining six were administratively adjudicated by the Department, with administrative penalties being meted out by Commissioner Raymond Kelly, who earned a well-deserved reputation among the rank and file as an extremely tough disciplinarian.

CCRB does not distinguish "chokeholds" - thus, CCRB has substantiated chokehold cases where the officer involved was not even aware that, in the course of wrestling a violent felon into custody, he momentarily restricted the breathing of the suspect during a minutes-long arrest process. Indeed, CCRB "substantiates" chokehold cases where the "choke" was incidental, accidental, unintentional or even unknown to the officer involved. These are the factors considered by the Department when determining punishment to its members - not the simple reliance upon the inflammatory and often misused term "chokehold".

Finally, we note that a prerequisite to arresting officers for the use of a chokehold is a Penal Code that criminalizes it. There is none, nor should there be, insofar as there are already numerous laws on the books - both State and Federal - that criminalize the use of intentional excessive force by police officers.

We suggest that Commissioner Peters reconsider his unwarranted threat. The image of yet another cowboy riding down Main Street shouting "I'm the new law in Town" does nothing to further the serious discussion needed to mend the fabric of the City.

September 11th Victim Compensation Fund

If you are diagnosed with a 9/11 related illness it is not too late to file a claim.

What are the deadlines for filing a claim with the Fund and what forms must be filed by the deadlines? (Updated: April 4, 2014)

There are two important deadlines for filing a VCF claim:

• The first deadline is the date by which you must Register with the VCF to be recognized as a Claimant. This deadline is different for each Claimant as it is dependent on individual circumstances as explained below.

The second deadline is the date by which you must file your completed Eligibility and Compensation Forms and the required supporting documents. This deadline is *October 3, 2016* and is the same for *all* claimants.

Deadline 1: Register (file a REGISTRATION FORM) with the VCF:

In general, Claimants with a qualified condition who plan to file a claim with the Fund will have two (2) years from the date of diagnosis to file a REGISTRATION FORM in order to preserve the right to file a claim. See FAQ 1.2 for the list of qualified conditions. This chart: <u>http://www.vcf.gov/pdf/RegisterChart.pdf</u> summarizes the specific deadlines for filing a claim with the VCF depending on individual Claimant circumstances. The Special Master does not have the authority to extend the filing deadlines.

* The applicable deadline is the date by which the required forms must be submitted/uploaded to your online claim or postmarked (if sending by mail). If the date falls on a Sunday or a Federal Government holiday, the forms must be submitted/uploaded or postmarked by the next business day.

To Register with the VCF: In order to meet the applicable two-year deadline, you must do one of the following:

• Claimants using the ONLINE system must complete and submit the Registration Form (and receive a VCF claim number).

Claimants submitting a HARD COPY claim must complete and mail Eligibility Form Part I, even if the remainder of the form is not complete.

Deadline 2: File Complete ELIGIBILITY AND COMPENSATION FORMS and required Supporting Documents:

The Zadroga Act authorizes the VCF to receive claims for five years from the date the VCF opened, which was October 3, 2011. Regardless of the applicable two (2) year deadline for filing your Registration Form with the VCF, *all* claim forms must be filed by **October 3**, **2016**. This includes your completed ELIGIBILITY AND COMPENSATION FORMS with the properly executed Attestations, Certifications and Exhibits.

CAUTION: Federal and state firearms laws are subject to frequent change. This summary is not to be considered as legal advice or a restatement of law. To determine the applicability of these laws to specific situations which you may encounter, you are strongly urged to consult a local attorney.

INTRODUCTION

Federal law does not restrict individuals from transporting legally acquired firearms across state lines for lawful purposes except those explicitly prohibited by federal law to include convicted felons; persons under indictment for felonies; adjudicated "mental defectives" or those who have been involuntarily committed to mental institutions; illegal drug users; illegal aliens and most nonimmigrant aliens; dishonorably discharged veterans; those who have renounced their U.S. citizenship; fugitives from justice; persons convicted of misdemeanor crimes of domestic violence; and persons subject to domestic violence restraining orders. Therefore, no federal permit is required (or available) for the interstate transportation of firearms. Title 18- Part 1- Chapter 44- s926A.

Many states and localities have laws governing the transportation of firearms. Travelers must be aware of these laws and comply with legal requirements in each jurisdiction. There is no uniform state transportation procedure for firearms. If in doubt, a traveler should carry firearms unloaded, locked in a case, and stored in an area (such as a trunk or attached toolbox) where they are inaccessible from a vehicle's passenger compartment and not visible from outside the vehicle. Any ammunition should be stored in a separate locked container.

While FOPA applies in every United States jurisdiction, experience has shown that some jurisdictions provide particular challenges to those transporting firearms. Knowing the local laws of such places is particularly important and may make traveling through them easier. The following states (California, Hawaii, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York & Washington DC) are known to have especially strict and complicated gun control laws and travelers should consult the state laws directly, along with local law enforcement and states' attorneys general resources for detailed information.

Just before retiring, some young puppy was busting my shoes about how law enforcement has changed, and the system is improving for the best.

I just smiled and gave him a little laugh.

We all saw the change in our jobs. I came on in 1970. I used to tell the rookies that our academy lasted 3 months. They gave us a stick, a gun, a dime, and kicked us out into the street. They told us: If you need help, use the dime. If you can't get to a phone, use the stick. If using the stick pis*** him off, use the gun.

And the first order we received when we were assigned to a pct. was from our patrol sergeant. His order was "Don't you EVER bother me, kid."

Law enforcement then, was much different than the current mission. We delivered babies, got rough in the alley when we needed to, made "Solomon like" decisions at least once a tour, and often wound up being big brother to the kid we roughed up in that alley a year or so ago. And, for some reason, none of that managed to get on a report.

And the department didn't really want to know. All they wanted was numbers, and no ripples in the pond.

Because of the changing times, and the evolution of Law Enforcement, the modern young officers will never see that form of Policing, and of course this is best. The current way is the right way... now. But it was different then (ergo, the Dinosaur Syndrome).

When it's time to go, we wonder if we're going to miss the job, after all, other than our kids and a few marriages, it was the most important thing in our lives. Actually, it was the other way around.

The job was first, but only another cop could understand how I mean that.

But have faith brother! After a short time of feeling completely impudent, (After all, you're just John Q. now), reality hits like a lead weight.

After all, what they gave us was just a job. What we made of it was a profession. We fulfilled our mission, and did the impossible each and every day, despite the department and it's regulations.

I think the thing that nags you the most when you first retire is: After you leave the job and remove your armor, the part of you that you tucked away on that shelf for all those years, comes out. It looks at all the things you've hidden away. All the terrible, and all the wonderful things that happened out there. And it asks you the questions that no one will ever answer.

"Do you think I did OK? Did I make a difference? Was I a good cop?

You know what Yeah, you were a good cop! And you know it!

In closing,

The best advice I got, by far, was from an old friend who left the job a few years before me. He told me to stay healthy, work out and watch my diet. He said "Cause that way, the first day of every month you can look in the mirror, smile and say.. Screwed them out of another month's pension!!"

Create Your Filing System

Generally, your home file should include all the items you refer to frequently including bills, warranties, bank statements, etc. You'll also need a secondary storage location for your more important, difficult to replace papers, such as passports, vehicle titles, birth certificates, etc. A fireproof/waterproof safe may be one possibility, but it's better to store those records in a location away from home, such as a bank safe deposit box. Simplify Your Life Cut Down on Mail Solicitations

You can cut down on the amount of mail solicitations you receive - including credit card, insurance, and magazine offers; catalogs; requests for donations; retail promotions; and bank offers. (Bills, statements, notices and political mailings cannot be stopped.) Go to the Direct Marketing Association Web site at www.dmachoice.org to select what mail and e-mail you wish to receive or not receive. DMA requires all its

member organizations-which collectively account for 80 percent of the total marketing mail in the United States - to participate in its opt-out program.

You should place your home phone number or numbers, including any personal wireless phone numbers, on the national Do-Not-Call list. Callers are prohibited from making telephone solicitations to those number(s). Your number or numbers will remain on the list until you remove them or discontinue service - there is no need to re-register numbers. <u>www.donotcall.gov</u>

Pension & Compensation Scam

Federal auditors and local veterans are concerned about a novel lending practice that gives military pensioners money up front in exchange for signing over monthly benefits for a period of time. The industry markets itself to veterans who are in need of quick cash, not as predatory lending. In exchange for signing over future monthly pension payments for a certain period of time, veterans are promised a lump sum in advance, with few strings attached. After the time period ends, they're told, they'll get their monthly payments back. Cases are difficult to take to court because the contracts include clauses that prevent veterans from participating in class-action suits and lock them into arbitration. The company tells veterans that they can make an affordable loan to them, but ultimately the contract they sign is contrary to how it was pitched, where over five-year periods veterans end up paying back five to eight times the money borrowed.

Phone Scams Continue to be Serious

The IRS has seen a surge of these phone scams in recent months as scam artists threaten police arrest, deportation, license revocation and other things. The IRS reminds taxpayers to guard against all sorts of con games that arise during any filing season.

"If someone calls unexpectedly claiming to be from the IRS with aggressive threats if you don't pay immediately, it's a scam artist calling," said IRS Commissioner John Koskinen. "The first IRS contact with taxpayers is usually through the mail. Taxpayers have rights, and this is not how we do business."

The Dirty Dozen is compiled annually by the IRS and lists a variety of common scams taxpayers may encounter any time during the year. Many of these con games peak during filing season as people prepare their tax returns or hire someone to do so. This year for the first time, the IRS will issue the individual Dirty Dozen scams one at a time during the next 12 business days to raise consumer awareness.

Phone scams top the list this year because it has been a persistent and pervasive problem for many taxpayers for many months. Scammers are able to alter caller ID numbers to make it look like the IRS is calling. They use fake names and bogus IRS badge numbers. They often leave "urgent" callback requests. They prey on the most vulnerable people, such as the elderly, newly arrived immigrants and those whose first language is not English. Scammers have been known to impersonate agents from IRS Criminal Investigation as well.

"These criminals try to scare and shock you into providing personal financial information on the spot while you are off guard," Koskinen said. "Don't be taken in and don't engage these people over the phone."

The IRS will never:

Call to demand immediate payment, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.

Phishing Remains on the IRS "Dirty Dozen" List of Tax Scams for the 2015 Filing Season

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service today warned taxpayers to watch out for fake emails or websites looking to steal personal information. These "phishing" schemes continue to be on the annual IRS list of "Dirty Dozen" tax scams for the 2015 filing season.

"The IRS won't send you an email about a bill or refund out of the blue. Don't click on one claiming to be from the IRS that takes you by surprise," said IRS Commissioner John Koskinen. "I urge taxpayers to be wary of clicking on strange emails and websites. They may be scams to steal your personal information."

Compiled annually, the "Dirty Dozen" lists a variety of common scams that taxpayers may encounter anytime but many of these schemes peak during filing season as people prepare their returns or find people to help with their taxes.

Illegal scams can lead to significant penalties and interest and possible criminal prosecution. IRS Criminal Investigation works closely with the Department of Justice (DOJ) to shutdown scams and prosecute the criminals behind them.

Stop and Think before Clicking

Phishing is a scam typically carried out with the help of unsolicited email or a fake website that poses as a legitimate site to lure in potential victims and prompt them to provide valuable personal and financial information. Armed with this information, a criminal can commit identity theft or financial theft.

If you receive an unsolicited email that appears to be from either the IRS or an organization closely linked to the IRS, such as the Electronic Federal Tax Payment System (EFTPS), report it by sending it to <u>phishing@irs.gov</u>.

It is important to keep in mind the IRS generally does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as text messages and social media channels. The IRS has <u>information</u> <u>online</u> that can help you protect yourself from email scams.

Remember, too, the IRS does not use email, text messages or any social media to discuss your personal tax issue involving bills or refunds. For more information on reporting tax scams, go to www.irs.gov and type "scam" in the search box.
