### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGES

Hi All,

I hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving and that the delicious food you ate, and will continue to eat throughout this holiday season, stays off of the thickest parts your body.

Every Thanksgiving I spend time reflecting on what I am thankful for. As in previous years, I am thankful that I was able to collect my pension for another year and to spend the holiday at home with family and friends, unlike our law enforcement heroes who have died in the line of duty. Additionally, I am extremely thankful that I am no longer actively involved in policing.

The "JOB" that I and many of you were part of is a thing of the past. (See pg. 6) Law enforcement officers are constantly being attacked by anti-police organizations, police reformers and socialist politicians who pass laws that favor criminals and make it difficult for officers to properly and successfully perform their duties

Sadly this war against the Thin Blue Line continues. As of this writing 57 law enforcement officers who have been shot and killed in the line of duty this year.

A recent survey conducted by the NYPD showed that more than half of the NYPD wishes they never joined the force. That is no wonder considering the Black Lives Matter riots, the Defund the Police movement, bail-reform laws that keep violent offenders out of jail, and legislative measures that put the burden of liability on officers while emboldening criminals.

Here are some recent headlines and excerpts of news articles that shows the lack of respect and callous treatment of our brothers and sisters in blue that leads to the demoralization of those who serve in a once proud profession.

"Black Lives Matter Leader Blames LAPD For Swatting, even After Culprits Are Charged" Officers responded to the home of Melina Abdullah, a leader of Black Lives Matter Los Angeles after a 911 caller claimed a man was holding hostages inside.

Abdullah streamed live on Instagram as she came out of her house with her hands up to more than 20 LAPD officers, many in SWAT gear, who had her surrounded .

Abdullah said after the incident she doesn't believe that police actually received a 911 call reporting a kidnapping at her home, calling the claim "cockamamie."

"My house was surrounded by LAPD this morning. We had assault rifles drawn on me and my three children and they came up with some cockamamie story about, they got a call that the people in this residence are being held hostage. We know that's not true," Abdullah said at a previously planned news conference at Cal State L.A. "We don't even believe they got that call. We believe it's yet another tactic that's being used to block us from ushering in black freedom.'

A grand jury indicted five Georgia police officers on murder charges in the death in 2019 of a 24-year-old male who resisted arrest and was tased after being stopped by the police while walking down naked along a road after attending a Concert

### "MSNBC's Joy Reid Says It's 'Traumatizing' For Police To Give Out Turkeys For Thanksgiving"

Reid complained about police giving motorists free turkeys in honor of the Thanksgiving holiday, calling the interactions "traumatizing."

"Please stop doing this, officers, especially to Black people," the MSNBC commentator demanded in a <u>Twitter</u> post. "It's traumatizing, given the history of what happens to us in traffic stops."

Some of Reid's supporters responded that handing out turkeys instead of citing people for traffic infractions is nothing more than a "PR stunt."

"I don't want no pig giving me a turkey," one person declared.

Many, including Reid, accused officers of making "fake traffic stops" just so they could traumatize black people.

Reid later commented on her own tweet, saying that "terrifying people with a fake and possibly unlawful traffic stop is not smart public relations."

### "Ex-con who once tried to kill NYPD cop is freed without bail after another attack on officer"

He had previously served 2 years of a 5 year prison sentence after pleading guilty to second-degree attempted murder for stabbing a cop.

And closer to home: "NC Principal Apologizes for Letting Football Player Honor Fallen SRO with "Blue Lives" Flag" "In no way was the carrying of the flag on Friday night intended to be a political statement or a representation of the greater beliefs of our community, nor the political beliefs of the player carrying it," the message said. "Instead, the intention was from one police officer family to another honoring Officer Herrera. We are deeply sorry for the unintended consequence of how it made some of our school family feel."

The football player carrying the blue line flag was Michael Poncia, son of club members Christopher and Christine Poncia.

Here is an email I received after the incident: Harvey, this is our son...he was devastated by Officer Herrera's death and wanted to honor him at the game that night...he asked permission a week prior to carry the Blue Line flag onto the field at the Homecoming game and Chris & I bought him the flag at Lawman's.....3 days after the game a complaint was made calling it a racist action.....it's sad & disappointing the way this event has totally been twisted....on a positive note In the midst of our son being cyber bullied & called a racist there has been a high level of support for his gesture, support of law enforcement and the original intention of his actions for Julio's memory. It will always be the 'thin blue line' flag to our family!! Thank you for your support! Be safe!

At our December board meeting we will be honoring Michael for his noble gesture.

If you have filed the Opt-out form on-line or mailed it, but have not received a conformation that it was received, I strongly recommend that you call 1-833-325-1190 and have it filled out over the phone.

I have been given the run-around in my attempt to verify that my Opt-out form has been received.

I initially submitted the form online in mid Sept. I submitted it a second time online in October when a new opt-out form added a cut-off date of Nov. 30.

I called the 833-325-1190 hotline to verify that my opt-out form had been received and was told that if it was submitted it on-line I had to contact the NYC Office of Labor Relations.

I then called the NYC OLR over a dozen times and after going through lengthy announcements I was unable to reach a live person and I got disconnected.

I then submitted an email on Nov. 2 to the NYC OLR asking for verification and 2 weeks later. I received an email telling me, "To confirm receipt of your opt-out form, you must call the **special Alliance call center at 1-833-325-1190."** 

Back to square one, I again called 1-833-325-1190 and was again told they could not verify receipt of my opt-out form because it was submitted on-line. I then had the customer service rep fill out the form over the phone, was given a reference number and 15 minutes later received an email confirming receipt of my request to opt out of the NYC Medicare Advantage Plus Plan.

The 2022 Medicare Part B Monthly premiums have been posted as well as the 2022 Medicare Annual Deductible.

Medicare Part B: The **standard monthly premium** for Medicare Part B enrollees for 2022 will be \$170.10; an increase of \$21.60 from \$148.50 in 2021.

The **annual deductible** for all Medicare Part B beneficiaries in 2022 will be \$233; an increase of \$30 from the annual deductible of \$203 in 2020.

Part B **monthly premiums are based on a person's income**. The income-related monthly adjustment amounts (IRMAA's) are listed on the following site: <a href="https://www.medicare.gov/your-medicare-costs/part-b-costs">https://www.medicare.gov/your-medicare-costs/part-b-costs</a>

Fortunately for us the premium increase does not negatively impact us because we are reimbursed for the Medicare premiums as long we remain on a NYC insurance plan.

### **Financial Information**

As a result of the 6.2% rate of inflation Social Security recipients will receive a 5.9% Cost of Living increase in 2022.

### Required Minimum Distributions (RMD's)

In 2020, due to the COVID 19 pandemic the IRS waived the RMDs for certain retirement accounts. The waiver was not extended for 2021. If you are over 72 years of age and have accounts that require you to take the RMD, make sure you do so before the Dec. 31 deadline (April 1, 2022 for those turning 72 in 2021).

#### **Beneficiaries**

A periodic review is recommended to ensure they are correct. This review is especially important following a life event such as a marriage, divorce, birth or death. It is also recommended to choose contingency beneficiaries where possible, in the event your chosen beneficiary pre-deceases you.

#### **Contribution Limits**

The contribution limit for employees who participate in 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan is increased to \$20,500. Limits on contributions to traditional and Roth IRAs remains unchanged at \$6,000. The catch-up contribution limit for employees aged 50 and over who participate in 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan unchanged at \$6,500. Therefore, participants in 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan who are 50 and older can contribute up to \$27,000, starting in 2022.

**Pension Protection Act - New York City Police Pension Fund (nyc.gov)** In 2006, Congress passed the Pension Protection Act ("PPA"), which contains many provisions that affect members of the New York City Police Pension Fund. Among those provisions is the ability to exclude up to \$3,000 from the amount of income distributions reported to the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") for payment of premiums for accident or health insurance or long-term care insurance.

- Distributions used to pay premiums for a spouse and dependent children are also excludable.
- This exclusion can be made if the amount paid for the premium would have otherwise been included in your income and is deducted directly from your pension allowance.
- What this means for retired NYPD officers is that the cost of the City's optional benefit rider may be excluded from the total
  amount of your pension reported annually.
- The maximum amount allowed by the PPA to be excluded is \$3,000; however, the amount excluded may not exceed the
  actual amount paid.
- To claim this benefit, you must reduce the taxable benefit on line 16B of the 1040 by the amount of the exclusion and write "PSO" on the line for "public safety officer."
- The exclusion will not be reported on 1099 forms issued by the City, so any retiree who claims the benefit has a responsibil
  ity to report it to the IRS.

Accordingly, pensioners who retired on ADR (accidental disability retirement) are not eligible for this exclusion because at this time their pension is not taxed.

This information is provided as a courtesy to Police Pension Fund members and is based on the Fund's current understanding of the law, but does not constitute tax advice and should not replace the advice of a qualified tax professional.

Note: Retirees should save their Quarterly Statement (for those with electronic deposit) or their monthly pension check stub, in order to document their premium deductions for any health insurance or long term care insurance, as required proof for the IRS, if asked. ### **NYSP - Pistol Permit Recertification:**

As per New York State Law, pistol permit holders need to recertify every five (5) years via the New York State Police website. January 2022 will be the fifth anniversary of the enactment of this requirement. Below is the website to check your status and to recertify. Remember, it is your responsibility to recertify your permit whether you receive a notification letter or not.

### Was I a Good Cop? \*\*

"Thoughts from an anonymous cop who retired in '87" (When the "JOB" was still something to be revered).

Just before retiring, some young puppy was busting my chops about how law enforcement has changed, and the system is improving for the best. I just smiled and gave him a little laugh. He asked what was so funny. I told him that I felt sorry for him. When asked why, I told him, "Because in about 15 years, THIS is going to be your good old days."

We all saw the change in our jobs. I came on in 1965. I used to tell the rookies that our academy classes lasted 3 months. They gave us a stick, a gun, a dime, and kicked us out into the street. They told us: If you need help, use the dime. If you can't get to a phone, use the stick. If using the stick pisses him off, use the gun. And the first order we received when we were assigned to a precinct was from our sergeant. His order was "Don't you EVER bother me, kid."

Law enforcement then, was much different than the current mission. We delivered babies, got rough in the alley when we needed to, made "Solomon-like" decisions at least once a tour, and often wound up being big brother to the kid we roughed up in that alley a year or so ago. And, for some reason, none of that managed to get on a report. And the department didn't really want to know. All they wanted was numbers, and no ripples in the pond.

Because of the changing times, and the evolution of law enforcement, the modern young officers will never see that form of policing, and of course this is best. The current way is the right way... Now. But it was different then (ergo, the Dinosaur Syndrome).

When it's time to go, we wonder if we're going to miss the job. After all, other than our kids and a few marriages, it was the most important thing in our lives. Actually, it was the other way around. The job was first, but only another cop could understand what I mean by that.

But have faith, brother! After a short time of feeling completely impotent (after all, you're just John Q. now), reality hits like a lead weight. It's not the job we miss after all. It's what we, as individuals, had accomplished while in this profession that we miss. The challenge of life and death, good and bad, right and wrong, or even simply easing the pain of some poor bastard for a while, someone we will never see again. We know the reality of what's happening out there. We are the ones who have spent our entire adult life picking up the pieces of people's broken lives. And the bitch of it all is that no one except us knows what we did out there.

I was once told that being a good street cop is like coming to work in a wet suit and peeing in your pants. It's a nice warm feeling, but you're the only one who knows anything has happened.

What I missed mostly, though, were the people I worked with. Most of us came on the job together at the age of 21 or 22, as I did. We grew up together. We were family. We went to each other's weddings, shared the joy of our children's births, and we mourned the deaths of family members and marriages. We celebrated the good times, and huddled close in the bad.

We went from rookies who couldn't take our eyes off of the tin number of the old timer we worked with, to dinosaurs.

After all, what they gave us was just a job. What we made of it was a profession. We fulfilled our mission, and did the impossible each and every day, despite the department and its regulations.

I think the thing that nags you the most when you first retire is: After you leave the job and remove your armor, the part of you that you tucked away on that shelf for all those years, comes out. It looks at all the things you've hidden away. All the terrible and all the wonderful things that happened out there. And it asks you the questions that no one will ever answer. "Do you think I did OK? Did I make a difference? Was I a good cop?" You know what? Yeah, you were a good cop! And you know it!

That's all I wanted to hear from those who know, my brothers & sisters.

It doesn't matter whether you celebrate Christmas, Hanukkah, or another religious holiday, it's that time of the year when our thoughts turn to the joys of gathering with family and friends in the spirit of thankfulness and giving.

During this holiday season I ask that you continue to pray for the safety of all law enforcement officers and first responders. On behalf of our entire board I wish you and yours a very joyous, healthy and safe holiday season.







#### Communications & Bills

After a Charlotte high school football player carried a Blue Lives Matter flag onto the field to honor a school resource officer who
recently died of COVID-19, the principal of the school apologized to those who were offended.

The player carried the flag for Officer Julio Herrera who died in early October of COVID 19.

"In no way was the carrying of the flag on Friday night intended to be a political statement or a representation of the greater beliefs of our community, nor the political beliefs of the player carrying it," the message said. "Instead, the intention was from one police officer family to another honoring Officer Herrera. We are deeply sorry for the unintended consequence of how it made some of our school family feel."

The following was received from club members Christine & Chrstopher Poncia. Their son Michael was the football player who carried the flag. "Harvey- this is our son...he was devastated by Officer Herrera's death and wanted to honor him at the game that night...he asked permission a week prior to carry the Blue Line flag onto the field at the Homecoming game and Chris & I bought him the flag at Lawman's.....3 days after the game a complaint was made calling it a racist action.....it's sad & disappointing the way this event has totally been twisted....on a positive note In the midst of our son being cyber bullied & called a racist there has been a high level of support for his gesture, support of law enforcement and the original intention of his actions for Julio's memory. It will always be the 'thin blue line' flag to our family!! Thank you for your support! Be safe!"

### Pension Proection Act - New York City Police Pension Fund (nyc.gov)

In 2006, Congress passed the Pension Protection Act ("PPA"), which contains many provisions that affect members of the New York City Police Pension Fund. Among those provisions is the ability to exclude up to \$3,000 from the amount of income distributions reported to the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") for payment of premiums for accident or health insurance or long-term care insurance.

Distributions used to pay premiums for a spouse and dependent children are also excludable.

This exclusion can be made if the amount paid for the premium would have otherwise been included in your income and is deducted directly from your pension allowance.

What this means for retired NYPD officers is that the cost of the City's optional benefit rider may be excluded from the total amount of your pension reported annually.

The maximum amount allowed by the PPA to be excluded is \$3,000; however, the amount excluded may not exceed the actual amount paid.

To claim this benefit, you must reduce the taxable benefit on line 16B of the 1040 by the amount of the exclusion and write "PSO" on the line for "public safety officer."

The exclusion will not be reported on 1099 forms issued by the City, so any retiree who claims the benefit has a responsibility to report it to the IRS.

Accordingly, pensioners who retired on ADR (accidental disability retirement) are not eligible for this exclusion because at this time their pension is not taxed.

This information is provided as a courtesy to PPF members and is based on the Fund's current understanding of the law, but does not constitute tax advice and should not replace the advice of a qualified tax professional.

Note: Retirees should save their Quarterly Statement (for those with electronic deposit) or their monthly pension check stub, in order to document their premium deductions for any health insurance or long term care insurance, as required proof for the IRS, if asked. No other documentation will be provided by the Pension Fund. Please contact Marie Elena Brusco @ (212) 693-6058 questions regarding this matter.



### **NYC Health Benefits Program**

Questions about your IRMAA or Medicare Part B Reimbursements?

Medicare Part B 2020 reimbursements were issued in April 2021. Please check your bank account/statement (or the mail, if you are receiving a physical check) for your payment. If you already submitted your Medicare Part A & B card to the Health Benefits Program, this payment is automatic and you will receive it annually.

Medicare Part B 2019 differential reimbursements were issued in March 2021. Please check your bank account/statement (or the mail, if you are receiving a physical check) for your payment. For those retirees/eligible dependents who are not eligible for IRMAA, Medicare Part B 2019 differential payments up to \$318 will be issued once the Medicare Part B and IRMAA payments are processed in calendar year 2020.

Those retirees/eligible dependents who are eligible for 2019 Medicare Part B differential reimbursements must submit the <u>Medicare Part B 2019 Reimbursement Differential Request Form</u>, along with required documentation.

### IRMAA 2020 reimbursements will be issued in October 2021.

This is separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you should have received a check in the mail.

If you did not receive your IRMAA reimbursement by December 1, 2020 or if you did receive the reimbursement and you believe the amount is incorrect, you must resubmit the **IRMAA 2019 Reimbursement Application**.

### IRMAA 2019 Differential payments were issued at the end of November 2020.

For those retirees/eligible dependents of a retiree with a Medicare Part B effective date prior to 2016, they received an additional amount up to \$318.

#### **Medicare Part B Reimbursement**

The City will reimburse retirees and their eligible dependents for Medicare Part B premiums paid, excluding any penalties. You must be receiving a City pension check and be enrolled as the contract holder for City health benefits in order to receive reimbursement for Part B premiums

For most retirees, the refund is issued automatically by the Health Benefits Program. If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This will be separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you will receive a check in the mail in June.

The reimbursement amount is based on the standard Medicare Part B premiums. If your Medicare Part B reimbursement amount was less than what you paid in Medicare Part B premiums, excluding penalties, you may be eligible for a Medicare Part B Differential reimbursement. To receive the differential reimbursement, please complete the Medicare Part B Differential Request form (below).

If you were eligible for Medicare Part B Reimbursement for prior years but did not enroll by providing a copy of your Medicare card, reimbursement is limited to the previous three (3) calendar years. To enroll, please complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application.

Statement from Citizens for the Extension of the James Zadroga Act on the Inclusion in the "Build Back Better"
Bill of Funding for the World Trade Center Health Program

Maloney, Nadler, Pallone, Schumer, Gillibrand ensure health care for thousands of injured and 9/11 responders and survivors

WASHINGTON, DC – Citizens for the Extension of the James Zadroga Act applauded the inclusion of the funding needed to ensure health care for thousands of 9/11 responders and survivors in the Build Back Better Bill (HR 5376) and the successful efforts of Members of Congress Carolyn Maloney, Jerrold Nadler, Frank Pallone and Senators Schumer and Gillibrand.

The funding language tracks the <u>"9/11 Responder and Survivor Health Funding Correction Act,"</u> HR.4965/S. 2683, which addresses the impending shortfall facing the World Trade Center Health Program (WTCHP) and provides full funding for the program for the next ten years.

In addition, the Build Back Better bill contains authorization for the World Trade Center Health Program to create a research cohort to better study the impact of the toxins at Ground Zero on those residents and students who were children and young adults at the time of the attack. Currently there is insufficient data on the potential health impacts because of the lack of sufficient research capabilities.

Benjamin Chevat, Executive Director of Citizens for the Extension of the James Zadroga Act said, "Reps. Maloney, Nadler and Pallone, and Senators Schumer and Gillibrand have kept faith with the pledge to "Never Forget" by making sure the funding for 9/11 responders and survivors was included in the Build Back Better Bill. Their work is a testament to their continuing determination to ensure that those injured and dealing with the impact of the toxins at Ground Zero, the Pentagon, and Shanksville will continue to be cared for."

While Congress authorized the health program to remain open until 2090, the funding needs of the WTCHP are projected to exceed the current funding formula that was created in 2015. With the inclusion of this funding in the Build Back Better legislation which Congress is considering this week, the WTCHP will have the sufficient funds it needs to provide care for all those still suffering the physical and mental impacts of 9/11 over the next ten years. This includes responders and survivors who will be newly diagnosed with 9/11-associated cancers caused by their toxic exposures.

NYPD unions to pull out of pension fund group, Comptroller Stringer urges them to reconsider

New York City police unions that hold partial control over how their members' pension money is invested are planning to pull out of a consortium of other city pension funds that Comptroller Scott Stringer has credited with considerably augmenting their return on investment.

In 2015, Stringer launched what's come to be known as the Common Investment Meeting, where the trustees of the city's five largest union pension funds meet to hash out how their money is managed.

Before that, each of the funds' trustees would meet separately in five different monthly meetings, which, from Stringer's perspective, was far less efficient.

According to Stringer, the CIM has boosted the pension funds' growth overall, with their rate of return hitting 11.58% over the five years since the CIM was created, compared to a 7.02% rate of return for the five years prior to its creation.

The police pension funds' trustees are made up of several police unions. The most powerful among them is the PBA.

The PBA's head, Patrick Lynch, pointed out that the CIM began as a pilot program and disputed the idea that, over the past five years, it's made life easier for the funds' trustees.

"We were invited to participate in the common-investment meeting on a trial basis. Based on that trial, we have determined that the current format is not the most efficient or effective way to address our members' needs," he said. "We look forward to continuing to work with both the current comptroller and the next one to provide the best possible stewardship of our members' funds."

With Stringer set to end his term as comptroller in December, it is not entirely clear who his successor will be, but odds are on the Democratic candidate, City Councilman Brad Lander (D-Brooklyn), who's been an outspoken critic of the NYPD for years.

When asked through a PBA spokesman to comment on whether the prospect of Lander becoming comptroller played into the police union's decision, Lynch said the actions are based on the CIM itself. Lander declined to comment. Stringer suggested that Lynch should reconsider.

"The men and women of the NYPD and their families deserve a secure retirement. It defies all logic and reason that certain police trustees want to pull out of a system that has made money for their members," Stringer said in a statement.

"There is no disputing the facts — the reforms we've made have dramatically raised the transparency, professionalism and most importantly the performance of our pension system. I believe once Mr. Lynch and others do the math they will realize this is not a decision that is in the best interest of their members."

In addition to the increased funding, the Build Back Better bill contains authorization for the World Trade Center Health Program to create a research cohort to better study the impact of the toxins at Ground Zero on those residents and students who were children and young adults at the time of the attack. Currently there is insufficient data on the potential health impacts to this population because of the lack of sufficient research capabilities.

Benjamin Chevat, Executive Director of Citizens for the Extension of the James Zadroga Act said, "Reps. Maloney, Nadler, and Pallone and Senators Schumer and Gillibrand, along with their colleagues, worked to make sure the funding for 9/11 responders and survivors was included in the Build Back Better Bill that the House of Representatives passed today and sent to the Senate for consideration. Their work is a testament to their continuing determination to ensure that those injured and dealing with the impact of the toxins at Ground Zero, the Pentagon, and Shanksville will continue to be cared for."

While Congress authorized the health program to remain open until 2090, the funding needs of the World Trade Center Health Program are projected to exceed the current statutory funding formula that was created in 2015. The legislation that passed in the House today, would provide the additional funding needed to prevent cuts in services to injured and ill 9/11 responders and survivors.

With the inclusion of this funding in the Build Back Better legislation, which was sent to the Senate for consideration, the Health Program will have the sufficient funds it needs to provide care for all those still suffering the physical and mental impacts of 9/11 over the next ten years. This includes responders and survivors who will be newly diagnosed with 9/11-associated cancers caused by their toxic exposures.



### NATIONAL NYCPD 10-13 ORG. NYPD ID CARD RENEWAL

For those members that reside locally, the ID Card Section (646-610-5150) is now on 2<sup>nd</sup> floor at 1PP, opposite the Operations Unit.

They will only renew a retiree ID card that has less than 3 months before expiration date or already expired

Please do not go at the end of month due to numerous active MOS retiring and it is very crowded.

Using the above number, call beforehand to make sure there is no promotion on the day you are going because it can get crowded and active will have priority.

For those out of state members, please follow the instructions when mailing in ID cards. I have received ID cards mailed to me using regular first-class mail. The issue with this is that it is not tracked and, therefore, not guaranteed that I will receive it. The Priority Mail procedure provides a tracking number so that the ID card can be accounted for throughout the entire mailing process.

If your ID card is lost or stolen, you must make a police report with your local precinct or PD for lost or stolen property and a copy of the report must accompany the ID card application. **The application will not be processed without a report.** 

The NYPD card section uses the photo that is in their system since November of 2002. If your ID card was issued prior to this period, you will have to appear at the ID Card Section in person to take a new photo. You cannot send in a passport photo or a jpeg file photo to update the picture.

**ONLY** cards issued after November 1, 2002, can be renewed this way. In all other circumstances, members will have to personally visit 1 P.P.

Regarding HR218/LEOSA qualifications: If your ID card does not have an expiration date, it does qualify as a valid ID card under the provisions of the laws. Unless you want to get a current photo on your ID card, you are not required to do so in order to satisfy the qualification. Also remember that some PDs in North Carolina that do the qualifications will require a current ID card so make sure that you check your expiration dates.

A completed PD form **MUST** accompany the card. The form can be downloaded from the National website; https://www.nationalnycpd10-13.org/

Additionally, ID card expiration dates will be increased from 5 to 8 years.

If your card has no expiration date, you do not need to have a new card issued. Your card is perpetually current. Keep it.

THE NATIONAL IS AUTHORIZED TO DELIVER MEMBERS CARDS TO 1 P.P. AND RETURN SAME TO THE MEMBER.


To insure security in the transfer of cards to and from our members the following procedure MUST be adhered to:

#### F.A.Q.

My ID Card was issued before November 2002. Why can't I have it renewed via proxy?

Prior to November 1, 2002 cards were not digital. Consequently the photo cannot be reproduced.

My card has no expiration date. Do I need to have a new card issued?

Definitely not. If you have no expiration date your card is perpetually current. Keep it.

\*\*\*\*\* Please note: To make things easier for Frank Martarella, our Club will be collecting ID cards quarterly in January, Apr., July & October and mailing them to him. The club will also pay for the postage..

There is a new procedure for pre-merger Transit and Housing Police retirees.

The below information was received in an email from the NYCPD Transit Bureau Personnel Unit and has been verified.

### Renewal of Transit ID card that is expired or nearing expiration.

For the retirees that live out of state, they can email a copy of their driver's license and id card and in the body of the email they can put their name, address and a phone number where they can be reached. We run a background check to make sure no one is wanted (you'd be surprised).

Also they need to attach a digital photo of themselves from the waist up in front of a neutral colored wall (please no hats or sunglasses).

We need a digital photo, not a photo of a photo, to put on a new id card that we mail certified.

Please tell your members they can call the Personnel Unit at 1-718-610-4660 and we will be more than happy to walk them thru the process.

Be well and keep collecting those retirement checks.

#### Dear Lieutenant:

As you may be aware, some of the City's municipal unions have signed a Memorandum of Understanding regarding vaccine mandates with the City. The Lieutenants Benevolent Association has not, and will not, sign the current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding the vaccine mandates.

Contained in the MOU is a clause stipulating that unvaccinated Members of the Service who file for retirement with the Police Pension Fund (those members who give their statutorily obligated 30 day notice informing the Department of their intention to separate from service) must sign an irrevocable waiver stating that he/she cannot rescind their retirement filing or "Pull their papers". The unvaccinated member, who files for retirement, must agree to never attempt to return to Active duty, even if they get vaccinated prior to their retirement date.

The Lieutenants Benevolent Association has been open to dialogue and negotiations with the City regarding COVID-19 issues throughout the pandemic. And we are still amenable to discussing issues impacting on our members regarding the pandemic. However, the inclusion of this irrevocable waiver stipulating that only "unvaccinated" Members of the Service who file for retirement may never return to service, even if they get the vaccine prior to separating from service, is completely unacceptable.

For the reasons I just mentioned, the LBA will not sign the current MOU with the City related to mandated vaccinations. The rights of the members of the LBA are paramount.

The 2022 Medicare Part B Monthly premiums have been posted as well as the 2022 Medicare Annual Deductible.

The November LBA Delegate and General Membership meeting was held at Antun's on Wednesday, November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021. LBA President Lou Turco chaired the meeting and the following topics were discussed:

**CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR RETIREES**: At the meeting Lou presented Retirement Shields to the following recently retired Lieutenants:

**Julien Antkies** of the 100<sup>th</sup> Precinct. Julien retired after serving with the Department for over 31 years. **Michael Bach** from TARU. Mike retired after serving 27 years with the Department. **Christina Gryziec** of Patrol Borough Queens North. Christina retired after serving with the Department for over 25 years.

ANNE DONNELLY (REP) WINS NASSAU COUNTY DISTRTICT ATTORNEY RACE: Anne Donnelly, who spoke to our members at the October LBA Delegate and General Membership meeting, was the victor in the Nassau County District Attorney election. Anne was successful in beating her opponent, New York State Senator Todd Kaminsky. Kaminsky is one of the main authors of the "cashless bail" law. His law has forced judges to release 3,000 inmates who have gone on to commit 9,000 new crimes. Anne's victory exemplifies how voter turnout is key in these races.

**ANNUAL UNIFORM ALLOWANCE TAX FREE**: As I informed the membership at the October LBA meeting, as the result of prolonged negotiations with the City of New York, the Lieutenants Benevolent Association has secured a tax free Uniform Allowance. All Active Lieutenants will now be entitled to the entire \$1,100 Uniform Allowance "Tax Free". As of this writing, approximately 35 of our Active Lieutenants have not yet submitted the Uniform Allowance Form electronically via the LBA website. If you have not yet submitted the form, please log onto the LBA website at <a href="www.NYPD-LBA.org">www.NYPD-LBA.org</a>, click on FORMS in the upper left and then click on the Uniform Allowance Form. We anticipate sending out the checks the week of December 6<sup>th</sup>; checks will be sent to the member's home address on file.

**DEPARTMENT'S VACCINE MANDATE**: On Wednesday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, we were informed that the Office of Equity and Inclusion would begin issuing decisions regarding requests for Reasonable Accommodation and that these decisions will be sent to the applicant's e-mail address. If you submitted a request for a Reasonable Accommodation, please make sure to monitor your e-mails for a decision from Office of Equity and Inclusion. If you received an e-mail stating that your request for a Reasonable Accommodation has been denied, the notification should have also included the process to file an appeal. If applicable, we encourage those whose request is denied to file an appeal as directed in the notification.



2022 Personalized LBA Card Orders

Due to an overall increase in the cost associated with the manufacturing, printing and shipping of the LBA Cards, the cost for each Personalized Card is \$2.00. Proceeds from the Personalized Card sales go to support the LBA Charitable and Scholarship Fund

LBA CALENDAR BOOKS: Historically, the LBA would mail out a Calendar Book to each Active, Retired and Life Member with the Annual Holiday Mailing. However, in recent years it has become apparent that more and more of our members no longer use a Calendar Book to track their overtime/appearances/appointments/ etc., but rather use their phones or some other electronic device to track these events. Therefore, we no longer include a calendar book with the Annual Holiday LBA membership mailing. If you still wish to receive an LBA calendar book simply call the LBA office at 212-964-7500 (Opton#2) and request a book be mailed to you.

CURRENT CCRB TOPICS/TRENDS: LBA  $2^{ND}$  Vice President Dennis Gannon informed the attendees that CCRB is currently focusing on investigating and enforcing the following issues:

Abuse of Authority - Failure to Provide Medical Attention to a Prisoner

To combat such complaints, we insist that our members ask EVERY prisoner if they want/require medical or psychiatric attention. Ensure that this request is recorded on Body Worn Camera (BWC) and a Command Log entry reflects the request, the response and the respective action if applicable. This procedure must be done for EVERY PRISONER.

Abuse of Authority – Removing a Person to the Hospital Against Their Will.

If there exists a need to remove an emotionally disturbed person (EDP) / prisoner to receive medical/psychiatric attention we urge our members to attempt to video the incident/behavior (if possible) leading up to such an action. We strongly encourage you to document the incident and include interviews with all witnesses, i.e. MOS and family members, and the mental state/actions of the person removed. CCRB is entertaining allegations of abuse of authority made by any person involuntarily removed to receive psychiatric attention.

Please ensure that you are thoroughly prepared for all CCRB hearings. The investigators at CCRB take their jobs seriously and look for any reason to bolster their case against a Subject/Witness officer. I cannot emphasize enough that you must adequately prepare before going to any CCRB hearing. This includes conferring with any officer(s) that may have already testified at CCRB on the same case, reviewing any pertinent body camera footage related to the case, and reviewing any pertinent documentation that may be associated with the case. Please prepare properly before appearing at a CCRB Hearing. Don't take these hearings lightly, because the investigators at CCRB are looking for any reason to strengthen their case against you.

**PBA President Patrick J. Lynch said:** "This video is incredibly disturbing. We have a police officer in distress, and nobody helps him. Is this the city we want? Has this become normal? It has to stop. We need your help. We need your help on the street, and we need your help to force our reckless elected officials to do their job."





The handbook contains information of all of the medical coverage provided to NYC employees and retirees covered by GHI Comprehensive Benefits Plan.

Additionally, many members are still unaware of the GHI Catastrophic Coverage provided by the Superior Officers Council, Sergeants Benevolent Association and the Detectives Endowment Association.

This benefit was established to assist members and eligible dependents to defray some of the non-covered medical and surgical expenses incurred for services rendered by non-participating or out-of-net-work providers and to provide coverage for catastrophic illness.

The below information is listed on their respective websites.

#### SOC

Members must incur out-of-pocket expenses of more than \$4000.00 per year. (Out-of-pocket expenses are those medical and hospital charges that are considered reasonable and customary by GHI and that are not reimbursed by either the City Health Plan or private insurers).

Members must produce a statement of services, explanation of benefits form and cancelled checks for expenses submitted. Reimbursement is based on a contract year (January - Dec.) 100% of GHI reasonable and customary charges based on the current profile.

The maximum lifetime benefit is 2 million dollars.

The SOC provides a self-funded \$1,000 direct reimbursement payable to the member after the member has submitted, qualified paperwork under the GHI Catastrophic Rider outlined above and the member still has a minimum of at least \$4,000.00 of out-of-pocket qualified. The exclusions and restrictions are the same as the requirement for the catastrophic coverage benefit.

For example you may have paid \$10,000 dollars out-of-pocket expenses, but GHI's payment schedule only deems the reasonable and customary payment for the services to be \$6,000 dollars. The Member pays the remaining \$4,000 dollars of the balance and may now be eligible to receive \$1,000 dollars from the SOC Catastrophic Benefit.

The first \$25,000 is covered for Private Duty Nursing care and thereafter 50% of the remainder with a lifetime cap of \$50,000 per person. The cap for in-hospital Mental Health charges is \$10,000 individual lifetime maximum.

SOC – After a \$4000 annual family deductible, GHI pays 100% of reasonable and customary charges based on a current profile with a maximum lifetime payment of \$250,000 per person.

Limitations: The first \$25,000 is covered for private duty nursing care and 50% thereafter of the remainder with a lifetime cap of \$50,000 per person. The cap for in hospital mental health charges is \$10,000 per person.

#### **SBA—Eligibility**

SBA members are eligible, as well as spouses/domestic partners and dependent children who are covered under a participating provider organization (PPO) or a point-of service (POS) plan presently being offered by the New York City Employee Health Benefits Program.

#### **Definition of PPO and POS**

Participating provider organization (PPO) indemnity plans offer the option to use either a network provider or an out-of-network provider for medical and hospital care. PPO plans contract with health care providers who agree to accept a negotiated payment from the health plan and predetermined co-payments from subscribers as payment in full for a schedule of medical services provided. When the subscriber uses a non-participating provider, the subscriber is subject to deductibles and/or a higher price schedule. GHI/CBP is an example of a PPO.

SBA GHI Catastrophic Coverage continued.....

If the subscriber uses a network provider, health care delivery resembles that of a traditional HMO, with prepaid comprehensive coverage and little out-of-pocket costs for services.

When the subscriber uses an out-of-network provider, health care delivery resembles that of an indemnity insurance product, with less comprehensive coverage and subject to deductibles and coinsurance. HIP PRIME POS and U S. Health Care (QPOS) are POS plans.

The SBA H&W Fund catastrophic coverage plan does not cover subscribers of exclusive participating organizations (EPOs) because they do not provide any out of network benefits.

#### The catastrophic coverage benefit

The benefit pays up to 100 percent of reasonable and customary eligible expenses after a \$2,000 out-of-pocket annual deductible per person has been reached. Eligible out-of-pocket expenses are those SBA H&W Fund medical and hospital expense charges that are considered reasonable and customary by the basic City Health Plan and are not fully reimbursed by the City Health Plan or private group insurers.

#### Benefit limits and maximums

There is a lifetime maximum benefit of \$250,000 per covered person. Within this lifetime maximum are the following:

- (1) Mental health in-hospital care of \$10,000.
- (2) Required and approved private duty nursing is covered in full for the first unpaid \$25,000 and then at 50 percent for the remainder up to a lifetime maximum of \$50,000.

Services or charges not covered by the catastrophic benefit

In addition the benefit exclusions of the SBA H&W Fund, the catastrophic benefit does not cover outpatient psychiatric care and prescription drug charges. Ineligible charges such as experimental procedures or services not approved by the member's health plan are likewise not covered by this benefit. Medical, surgical and hospital charges incurred for services rendered by non-participating PPO providers or out-of-network POS providers must be approved by the member's health plan.

#### Submitting an SBA catastrophic benefit claim

Once you have reached the \$2,000 out-of-pocket, per-person annual deductible, obtain and submit the catastrophic claim benefit form to the Fund office for processing. Instructions are printed on the form.

DEA—There are two parts to the DEA Catastrophic coverage. The first part is an extra rider that the DEA purchased through GHI. There is a \$4,000 deductible (retired members) per calendar year.

Claims for non-participating doctors are submitted through GHI for their basic allowance. Because GHI's payment schedule is so low the member always has an out of pocket expense. When the difference between what your doctor's charges and what GHI allows exceeds \$4,000 you may apply for the DEA catastrophic benefit.

For catastrophic medical expenses after your G.H.I. basic refund, the DEA requires an out-of-pocket deductible of \$4,000 per family per calendar year. When G.H.I. original Explanation of Benefit (EOB) statements are submitted to the DEA reflecting the deductible, we will refund \$3,000 of the \$4,000 deductible. All covered expenses i.e., those claims in which GHI has made some level of payment, after the deductible will be processed at a 100% reimbursement level not to exceed \$250,000 lifetime per family. This catastrophic medical benefit applies only to members enrolled in the GHI-CBP program offered through the City of New York Health Benefits office.

There is an additional benefit under the DEA Catastrophic Benefit Program for Retired Members who do not qualify for the Catastrophic benefit described above.

For members who have out of pocket expenses ranging between \$2,000 and \$4,000 in a calendar year, the DEA Health Benefits Fund will reimburse you the amount between \$2,000 and \$4,000. GHI Explanation of Benefits (EOB) statements will be required for submission to the DEA in order to obtain reimbursement. # **NYC Health Benefits Program**

**City Coverage for Medicare-Eligible Retirees** 

In order to maintain maximum health benefits, it is essential that you join Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance) at your local Social Security Office as soon as you are eligible. If you do not join Medicare, you will lose whatever benefits Medicare would have provided.

#### **Medicare Enrollment**

You must notify the Health Benefits Program in writing immediately upon receipt of your, or your dependent's, Medicare card by completing the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Application: <a href="https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/olr/downloads/pdf/health/med-b-application.pdf">https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/olr/downloads/pdf/health/med-b-application.pdf</a>

For retirees 65 and older Social Security has sent the IRMA letters indicating your Medicare part B deductions for 2019. When you receive your Medicare reimbursement check in the spring of 2020 you submit that letter, a copy of the 1099 from Social Security and the reimbursement form for any addition money that was withheld. You are also reimbursed for your spouse's Medicare deductions. If you have not filed in the past you can go back and file for up to 3 past years.

#### **Medicare Part B Reimbursement**

The City will reimburse retirees and their eligible dependents for Medicare Part B premiums paid, excluding any penalties. You must be receiving a City pension check and be enrolled as the contract holder for City health benefits in order to receive reimbursement for Part B premiums.

For most retirees, the refund is issued automatically by the Health Benefits Program. If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This will be separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you will receive a check in the mail in June.

The reimbursement amount is based on the standard Medicare Part B premiums. If your Medicare Part B reimbursement amount was less than what you paid in Medicare Part B premiums, excluding penalties, you may be eligible for a Medicare Part B Differential reimbursement. To receive the differential reimbursement, please complete the Medicare Part B Differential Request form (below).

If you were eligible for Medicare Part B Reimbursement for prior years but did not enroll by providing a copy of your Medicare card, reimbursement is limited to the previous three (3) calendar years. To enroll, please complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application.

#### 2019 Medicare Part B Premium Reimbursement ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The standard reimbursement amount for Calendar Year 2019 is \$109.00 per person, per month. For those newly enrolled in Medicare in 2019, currently, the standard amount is \$135.50. The reimbursements will be issued in Apr.. If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your Medicare Part B reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This will be a separate payment from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you will receive a check in the mail in Apr..

Question: How do I enroll for the Medicare Part B reimbursement?

Answer: Complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application and return it with a copy of your Medicare card to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit.

Question: I am a City retiree. Is my spouse/domestic partner/Medicare-eligible dependent entitled to the Medicare Part B reimbursement?

Answer: Yes. They are eligible if they are covered under your City health plan and enrolled in Medicare Part B Reimbursement and the health plan has the dependent in Medicare status. Complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application and return it with a copy of their Medicare card to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit.

Question: I received the standard premium amount of \$109.00 per month for 2019 for the Medicare Part B reimbursement. However, I paid more than the standard amount. Can I be reimbursed for the difference?



# NYC Health Benefits Program City Coverage for Medicage File W. -

Answer: Yes. If your 2019 monthly Medicare Part B premium was between \$110.00 and \$135.50, you may be eligible for an additional reimbursement amount referred to as a differential payment. In order to receive the differential payment, the retiree and/or dependent must submit a copy of proof of this additional payment (for example, the Form SSA-1099, bank statements, CMS-500 Notice of Medicare Payment Due) to our office for review. If approved, you will receive the differential payment during the first quarter of 2021. For further information and to download the Medicare Part B Differential Request form, visit our website at nyc.gov/hbp.

If, however, you are enrolled in Medicare Part B as of 2016, you should have received reimbursement of \$135.50 per month automatically and no action will be required on your part.

Question: Many people received their reimbursement and I didn't get mine yet. What should I do?

Answer: Medicare reimbursements were deposited directly into the same account that you use for your pension payment. Please check your bank statement.

Question: I don't have direct deposit for my pension payment and still have not received my Medicare reimbursement. What should I do? Answer: You should write to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Please include your name, retiree spouse's name (if applicable) retiree's Social Security number, agency from which the retiree retired, current address, telephone number, and a copy of your Medicare card/ your spouse's Medicare card (if applicable). This review process may take up to 8 weeks from receipt of the above information. Question: The reimbursement I received is not the correct amount. What should I do?

Answer: You should write to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Include your name, Social Security number, current address and telephone number, and a copy of your Medicare card. State the reason you believe the amount is incorrect. This process may take up to 8 weeks from receipt of the information.

Question: The check that I received is torn/ripped and the bank will not cash it. What should I do?

Answer: You should return the check to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Include your name and Social Security number. It may take up to 8 weeks for a replacement check to be issued.

Question: I am the retiree and received a reimbursement for my spouse/domestic partner/Medicare- eligible dependent who died during the reimbursement year. What should I do?

Answer: Contact the Health Benefits Program in writing. Include both the retiree's and deceased individual's name, both Social Security numbers, address, phone number and a copy of the death certificate. Mail the information to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit.

Question: My spouse/dependent was a City retiree who died before the reimbursements were issued. How do I claim the reimbursement?

Answer: You should write to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Include the retiree's name and Social Security number, your name, your address, phone number and a copy of the death certificate. Upon receipt of the death certificate, we will contact you if further documentation is required.

Question: Do I have to re-enroll every year for the Medicare Part B Reimbursement?

Answer: No, but if you change your address, or if one of the eligible Medicare Part B recipients dies, you must notify the Health Benefits Program, in writing.

Question: What if my bank account information changes?

Answer: Please notify your pension system directly of any bank account changes. The changes will be automatically used for the Medicare Part B reimbursements.

Question: I paid more than the standard premium for Medicare Part B. Am I entitled to the higher premium reimbursement (IRMAA)?

Answer: You may be entitled to the higher reimbursement through Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA). Vist our website at nyc.gov/hbp for further information.

#### **IRMAA Medicare Part B Reimbursement**

If you paid more than the standard monthly reimbursement rate for Medicare Part B, as an Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA), you may be eligible for additional reimbursement. If you submit the required documentation for Medicare Part B IRMAA reimbursement, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account.

#### THE DO'S AND DON'TS OF CARRYING A CONCEALED HANDGUN IN NC

- 1. Your permit to carry a concealed handgun must be carried along with valid identification whenever the handgun is being carried concealed.
- 2. When approached or addressed by any officer, you must disclose the fact that you have a valid concealed handgun permit and inform the officer that you are in possession of a concealed handgun. You should not attempt to draw or display either your weapon or your permit to the officer unless and until he/she directs you to do so. Your hands are to be kept in plain view and you are not to make any sudden movements.
- 3. At the request of any law enforcement officer, you must display both the permit and valid identification.
- 4. You may not, with or without a permit, carry a concealed weapon while consuming alcohol or while alcohol or any substance, controlled or otherwise, is in your blood unless the substance was obtained legally and taken in therapeutically appropriate amounts.
- 5. You must notify the Sheriff who issued the permit of any address change within thirty (30) days of the change of address.
- 6. If a permit is lost or destroyed, you must notify the sheriff who issued the permit and you may receive a duplicate permit by submitting a notarized statement to that effect along with the required fee. Do not carry a handgun without it.
- 7. Even with a permit, you may not carry a concealed handgun in the following areas: a) Any law enforcement or correctional facility; b) Any space occupied by state or federal employees; c) Any premises where the carrying of a concealed handgun is prohibited by the posting of a statement by the controller of the premises; d) Public educational property, however, a permittee may secure a handgun in a locked vehicle; e) Areas of assemblies or demonstrations; f) State occupied property; g) Any state or federal courthouse; h) Any area prohibited by federal law; i) Any local government building if the local government had adopted an ordinance and posted signs prohibiting the carrying of concealed weapons. 8. If you are in a vehicle and stopped by a law enforcement officer, you should put both hands on the steering wheel, announce you are in possession of a concealed handgun and state where you have it concealed, and that you are in possession of a permit. Do not remove your hands from the wheel until instructed to do so by the officer.

#### IF A MEMBER DIES - INFORMATION TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OR FAMILY

(Hopefully Not Needed For A Long Time)

Too often spouses and families are left in a quandary upon the death of a loved one. Few situations in life are more stressful than when a spouse passes. All too often we have a difficult time focusing on the issues at hand and need guidance to get the deceased affairs in order. The following is a general guide for the widow(er) or the decease's family regarding important notifications that must be made by the surviving spouse and information you should have on hand when a retiree dies.

#### I. PREPARATIONS BEFOREHAND

- GATHER ASSETS This doesn't mean piling them all together. It means getting a list of all the assets at the time of the
  decedent's death, along with copies of statements, deeds, etc. This information is needed for probate. It's also essential
  for filing federal and state estate tax returns, if required.
- REVIEW IRAs If the surviving spouse is the beneficiary, decide whether to roll an IRA over to the surviving spouse.
- GET GOOD ADVICE and get it now. The money you pay to attorneys and other advisers to resolve issues NOW can be much lower than if you deal with problems AFTER a person's death.
- In case of couples, usually most of the property is held in joint names and the survivor obtains same "by operation of law". However, there may be some items which were held in the name of the deceased only, and in that case it would be necessary to go to Probate Court to transfer ownership of that property, unless listed in a trust.
- GET ORGANIZED NOW When someone dies, one of the big problems for beneficiaries is locating the things necessary
  to settle the estate. Make sure you know before the death occurs where to find the following documents and information. (This is just a partial list)
  - 1. Will
  - 2. Living Will
  - 3. Trust
  - 4. Deeds (if any).
  - 5. Safe-deposit boxes (location of boxes, contents and keys).
  - 6. Life insurance policies.
  - 7. Funeral and burial instructions.
  - 8. Names and addresses of creditors and debtors.
  - 9. List of assets and where they are located.
  - 10. List of all advisers (attorney, accountant, insurance agent, stockbroker, etc.).

#### II. STEPS TO BE TAKEN AFTER DEATH - Notifications to be made:

- Contact the NYPD Operations Unit located at One Police Plaza at (646) 610-5580, for pall bearers (Funeral Director will usually do this for you) for all five boroughs, all of Long Island and Upstate New York, but not beyond Dutchess County.
- 4. Contact Social Security: (800) 772-1213 (Funeral Director will usually do this for you).
- 5. Contact Fraternal Organizations to arrange for visitors, Color Guard and possible insurance benefits.

- 6. If a veteran, notify the Veterans Administration at (800) 827-1000 for: Grave marker, Funeral Allowance and Flag (Funeral Director will usually do this for you). If can't find discharge papers or DD 214, you will need date of Enlistment, date of Discharge, Branch & Serial Number. If deceased had 100% disability for 10 years, spouse is entitled to an additional benefit.
- 7. Notify your Church or Temple for announcements. (Funeral Director will usually do this for you).
- 8. Health Insurance: COBRA (Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985) COBRA has a safety net. If spouse or dependent was covered under deceased's health plan they may continue coverage under COBRA for up to 36 months. New York State in 2001 amended the Administrative Code to continue Health Care Coverage for Surviving Spouses for Life (Download Information Regarding this Amendment). This enables the deceased's spouse and/or dependents to receive coverage at the group rate. The City and the Line Organization health benefits stop at the death of the members. The rate, though high, is cheaper than the non group rate.

#### THIS INFORMATION PERTAINS TO COBRA

Police Officers & Firefighter surviving spouses are to follow this procedure

Attach a machine copy of the death certificate to a request for an application for COBRA FOR LIFE and send it to:

Retired Employees Benefits Section Att: Linda Harris (Cobra for Life) 40 – Rector Street – 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor New York, NY 10006

They will send the surviving spouse a <u>pre-numbered application</u> allowing the spouse to continue the health coverage the member had at a cost equal to 102% of what the City pays, which includes administrative fees. This is fairly reasonable. <u>Applying for this must be done within 30 days.</u> Benefits are retroactive if the surviving spouse requires medical attention during this interim period.

At this time if a member and spouse are of Medicare age, and reside in an area covered by Aetna, I would strongly recommend they choose that plan over GHI/EBC/CBP.

Also, they would need to consider the respective union plans as those plans would only be available for 36 months, and whether the health plan rider would be a better choice.

#### THINGS YOU WILL NEED

DEATH CERTIFICATES - Death Certificates are necessary in every step to the successful administration of a decedent's estate. (Usually Funeral will obtain certificates as part of his service at current cost). They are usually needed for:

Pension Bureau

**Veterans Administration (if a veteran)** 

Motor Vehicle Bureau if auto was in deceased's name. 1 for each insurance policy.

Court (If probate is needed).

Your State Department of Revenue to obtain non-tax certificate if real property is involved.

Bank accounts held in Trust for another 1 for each account if property held in a Trust.

Personal Records.

Note: If estate is probated, some of the above will take a Letter Testamentary instead of a Death Certificate.

#### MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE (With Official Raised Seal):

Social Security, (not necessary if surviving spouse already receiving benefits)

Veterans Administration, if a veteran.

#### LETTERS TESTAMENTARY or LETTERS OF ADMINISTRATION:

Motor Vehicle Bureau, if auto is in the deceased's name.

One for each bank account

Brokerage house account (share of stock or bonds, etc. that were in the deceased's name alone)

#### **DISCHARGE PAPERS: DD 214 - (Original needed)**

Social Security, if spouse was not already receiving benefits. Remember that service time counts toward qualification. They will Photostat.

Veterans Administration, if a veteran

#### **PAID FUNERAL BILLS:**

1 copy for Pension Bureau

1 copy for Probate Court

1 copy for IRS, if taxable estate.

#### OTHER THINGS THAT MAY APPLY (usually after burial)

Cancel any leases. (If your parent or loved one rented a home, cancel the lease after clearing out the furnishings) Inform insurance companies.

File life insurance claims for any policies on the person's life, and request that the insurers send you Form 712, Life Insurance Statement (this is a statement about the life insurance that must be filed with the estate tax return).

Make sure the car insurance company continues to cover the person's car until it's sold or transferred to a beneficiary.

Make sure the homeowners policy continues to provide adequate coverage for the person's things until removed from the home.

Notify companies the person did business with.

Cancel credit cards, and close charge accounts.

Have airlines to transfer frequent-flier miles to the primary beneficiary. (Each airline has different policy concerning this issue. Check with carrier about rules)

Consideration should also be given to making pre-death funeral arrangements. This provision, no matter how painful, should be discussed by couples and by parents with their families. Too often, spouse and children spend much too much money on a funeral and do so without really knowing what were the deceased's wishes in this regard (Place of burial, Cremation, etc.)

Consideration should also be given to having a "Family Durable Power of Attorney" (Someone to take over your finances if you become incapacitated or incompetent)

There are no words of comfort at such a difficult time, however, if you have all the necessary information at the ready it will expedite any claim that is pending, make the process run smoothly, and your stress level can be minimized.

#### 7 December 1906

Grafting Reporter and Policeman Sentenced

Charles R. PRICE, for years Police Headquarters' reporter for the "Daily News" and Policeman John J. BRYAN, formerly attached to the Leonard street station, were sentenced to-day in the Court of Special Sessions, Manhattan, to pay a fine of \$250 each or twenty days in the Tombs prison on the charge of a violation of Section No, 53 of the Penal Code in having made a corrupt bargain, the object of which was to make Policeman James A. DONOHUE, a roundsman for \$200.

The courtroom was crowded with policemen who were interested chiefly because Third Deputy Police Commissioner MATHOT was the complainant. He broke into a room occupied by PRICE at 299 Mulberry street, on May 31, and after a chase caught BRYAN.

District Attorney JEROME made a plea for clemency for both men, saying that in the case of BRYAN he had served fifteen years on the police force, saved human life and won a medal of honor. In PRICE's case he said that the wife and children of the defendant and his aged mother were the main suffers of his guilt. The accused will appeal.

Retired Policeman Drops Dead in Home

Michael BOWE, 54 years old, of 344 Thirteenth street, was found dead this morning by his wife, who discovered him lying on the floor in the rear parlor of their home. Death was the result of apoplexy, from which he has been a sufferer for two years. BOWE was a retired policeman. He had an excellent record.

#### 10 December 1906

O'KEEFE STIRS UP POLICE CAPTAINS

Deputy Police Commissioner Arthur J. O'KEEFE blossomed out as an energetic orator when he addressed the captains of Brooklyn and Queens at the State street headquarters. Mr. O"KEEFE was very much in earnest and told the captains a few plain facts which didn't make them feel any better. The Deputy made it plain he wanted them to attend more strictly to their duties, and pointed out some of the evils which he wanted to remedy right away.

Mr. O'KEEFE's recommendations were as follows:

First - Captains must be more courteous to citizens in general.

Second - They must pay attention to reports and complaints.

Third - They should look over their precincts at frequent intervals.

Fourth - They should be on the watch for prize-fighting.

Fifth - They should see that theatres do not violate the law, especially as to Sunday concerts.

Sixth - They should suppress rowdyism.

Seventh - They must make fuller and more complete reports to him and a recommendation or two wouldn't be amiss.

Eighth - They must be just in the matter of Sunday closing of stores.

Ninth - They must be on the lookout for gambling.

Tenth - They should not plead that they cannot accomplish work without the assistance of plainclothes men, who are not known to the persons in the precinct whom the police are after when they never ask for such men to be assigned to them.

#### 11 December 1906

POLICE TRIALS

-Peter J. REILLY, a policeman at the Flatbush avenue station, who on Nov. 7 walked into the station house and laid his shield on the desk before the sergeant, saying he was going to resign was before Deputy Commissioner O"KEEFFE this morning in the trial room at Police Headquarters. O'REILLY was asked by the Commissioner what he meant by resigning from the force one day and returning two days after. Not receiving a satisfactory answer he fined O'REILLY three days pay.

-Officers Christopher F. RYAN and James H. LIDDY were charged with being off their posts and in a saloon. Each was fined ten days' pay.

-Patrolmen Thomas E. HULBERT, of the Astoria station, had his sentence suspended after O'KEEFE learned he had performed meritorious acts of the time of the SLOCUM disaster. HULBERT was charged with being absent three hours after roll call.

-Although William STEVENS, of the Liberty avenue station has only been on the police force since May he has had six complaints made against him. He was in the court to-day for being absent from duty for twenty-six hours. O'KEEFE reserved decision, and his dismissal from the force is expected.

-When F. E. BUCKLEY, of the Richmond Hill station, was asked why he had failed to discover a broken fire box he presented a diagram of his beat to the Commissioner. It showed that his beat was over four miles long and over fifty fire boxes were located in his territory. After the Commissioner had carefully perused the diagram he remarked to BUCKLEY: "The only way to cover your beat is to be a bird and fly around it. I dismiss the complaint. You may return to your station."

#### 13 December 1906

#### BROOKLYN MEN LAND IN SERGEANTS JOBS

Police Commissioner BINGHAM today announced that he had promoted to the rank of sergeant Roundsman, James CLARE, of the Amity street station, and Detective George H. BUSBY, of the local headquarter's staff.CLARE'S name has been on the eligible list for more than a year, but it was said that because he had never reported a patrolman, MCADOO refused to appoint him. CLARE explained this morning that his district was small and that they men under him were especially capable patrolmen. He was sent to the Stagg street station.

Sergeant BUSBY was assigned to the Parkville station.




