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The saga of the City's new Medicare Advantage health plan continues.

On Thursday October 21, 2021, a New York State Supreme Court judge placed a stay on the rollout of the cities new Medicare Advantage Plus Plan, ordering the city to maintain the retirees current health care plans.

This injunction delays the rollout of the plan in an effort to provide more public information surrounding the plan, specifically which health care providers will accept the new plan.

What was to be a 10/31/21 deadline to opt out of the plan has been extended indefinitely. Before the City issues another deadline they have to submit a plan to the judge for his review so that the Court is satisfied that retirees can make an informed decision.

Please understand that this is a postponement and not a termination of the plans implementation. Affected club members are encouraged to carefully review the impact of this change on themselves and their families.

One important and easy way to do that is to watch a 26 minute You-tube video interview of attorney Steven Cohen that can be accessed at: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TvtGfCvME0M</u>

Steve clearly explains the implication of the judges decision and during the interview he suggests that anyone who has opted out may want to contact the City Medicare Advantage Plan hotline, 1-833-325-1190, and rescind their opt -out form. You can also call that number to confirm that they received your opt-out form.

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

In response to a coordinated effort between our club and Bob Young, president of the Raleigh 10-13 club, to rectify issues members of both our clubs are facing in receiving proper WTC health care screening in NC, Club trustee Dennis Cirillo sent the below letter to NC Congressman Dan Bishop.

Hi Congressman Bishop,

My name is Dennis Cirillo. I met you several months ago at a Republican Meeting in Monroe. I briefly introduced myself as the 9th Districts Delegate for AMAC (Association of Mature American Citizens) and left you my card. AMAC currently has over 4,700 members residing in NC 09 not counting their family members of eligible voting age. I am not writing to you today as an Action Delegate, but am writing as a member of the NYPD 10-13 Club of Charlotte, Inc. a club consisting of over four-hundred former and active police officers residing in NC. At our monthly meeting last evening, I learned that many of our 9/11 survivors are experiencing tremendous difficulty in having their health screenings performed here in North Carolina. Many of our members routinely schedule their testing in New York rather than deal with the problems they are experiencing here. I have learned that many of the local health care providers have dropped out of the program due to paperwork issues and other problems. The National 10-13 Association is working on attempting to rectify the situation; however, we certainly can use some help.

Here are some of our members comments regarding their problems:

"The issue is not so much the distance, although this facility is near uptown Charlotte and the next facility is Concord which is 35 miles from my residence. We live (here in Charlotte) in the biggest city in the state, and I always find it hard to believe we have 1 option, and they should not only be removed as a facility, I feel they should lose their license to practice. The issue is more about the type of facilities they contract out. They are clinics. They are old, some are dirty, and they seem very antiquated. I always say, walking into these facilities feels like going back in time. Like you're going back to the 1970's.DeArk Medical Center, I actually tried to have them removed as a facility because of the terrible experience I had there. I literally wouldn't take my dog there. It was dirty, and I initially looked past that. They escorted me to a room to wait. When the doctor came in he was wearing a mask and a plastic face shield and walked completely on the other side of the room. (I thought I wonder how he's going to examine me?) I went to take my mask off and he yelled at me "Please DO NOT take your mask off" I put it back on and said: "Then how can you look in my nose? How can you look down my throat?" He said, "We don't do that". I said, "what about a lung capacity test, or chest x-rays, are you going to listen to my breathing? Are you going to listen to my heart?" He said, "we don't do that". I said, "will you palpate my neck, check for tumors". He said: "we don't do that". He said " we need to do your paperwork right now. The next 2 questions (if I wasn't already sitting down) would have knocked me off of my feet. He actually asked me (from the other side of the room). "Do you know your height and weight? I said: "Are you kidding me? You don't have a tape measure here? You don't have a scale? I said, "You can take my urine, I will not let anybody stick a needle in my arm, and I'm leaving". My entire appt. was about 10 minutes. It should take 1 ½ to 2 hours. These are the types of facilities we have been subjected to over the years. It is truly a joke! We were all made a promise 20 years ago, that "We will never forget" and this is how they treat Police Officers, Fire fighters, and 1st responders who answered the call? The entire system needs to be revamped and we need more up to date "legitimate" doctors in real medical facilities to attend to us. They need to get away from all the "clinic" type facilities. They are old, dirty, and make you feel that they are just going through the motions. I can always be reached by phone, to speak to anyone who would like to discuss this further.

Here's another - "I have a horror story with these folks. I moved down here in 2008 went back to stony brook every year and was treated like a prince. In 2010 I figured it was time to join the national program so I didn't have to make the trip. What a mistake, I was sent to clinics that resembled third world countries in Rock Hill, SC and south Charlotte. I had to wait in general population sometimes up to three hours past my scheduled appointment time. Other than the colonoscopy appointment which went smooth in a nice facility in Ballantyne the rest of my experience was a horror show. So I quickly switched back to the NY program. Fast forward to a few months ago I started having serious 9/11 illness issues and can no longer make thrip back to NY. I was told the national program was much better so I decided to give it a try. That was April and I have yet to see a single doctor. First they emailed me a packet similar to the questioner you originally filled out when joining the program which in my case was 2003 so I had fresh memories of where I was assigned and how long I spent at certain locations. The package emailed to me now came twenty years later and even though I have 186 days certified at the site the national program not only wants to know where I worked but how many hours I worked. Not days but hours. In addition after you answer how many hours they want to know how many hours during the first five days than how many hours during the next twenty etc etc. To boot all those answers must add up to the original hours you first put down. Obviously this is no easy task so I called for assistance. I have been hung up on, put on hold for hours and when I finally got on the line with a case worker she did her best to help me and she assured me it all added up so I could go on and answer the next twenty parts of the packet myself. The problem Harvey...she never saved all that work so when I went back to answer the dozens of additional sections the hours were all screwed up again. On September 12th I received a letter from the two people running the national program thanking me for my service and telling me what a hero I was. The next day I received an email from the national program case workers threatening to kick me out of the program because I hadn't answered the thousands of questions they sent me in a timely manner."

Other comments include, "dirty, unprofessional, poorly staffed," and "I travel back to New York for cancer related issues, I was warned by others and WTC monitoring not to switch for service down here."

As you can see, these heroes are being treated horribly and obviously not deserving of this type of treatment. I was wondering if you would be able to meet with me and our President Harvey Katowitz to see if you are able to assist us. It would also be appreciated if you would be able to join us at our next meeting on November 9th in Charlotte. I appreciate any assistance you may be able to provide. On November 11, 1919 U.S. President Woodrow Wilson first proclaimed Armistice Day. In proclaiming the holiday, he said "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations."

The United States Congress passed a concurrent resolution seven years later on June 4, 1926, requesting that President Calvin Coolidge issue another proclamation to observe November 11 with appropriate ceremonies. A Congressional Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U.S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday: "a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day'."

In 1945, WWII veteran Raymond Weeks from Birmingham, Alabama had the idea to expand Armistice Day to celebrate all veterans, not just those who died in World War I. Weeks led a delegation to Gen. Dwight Eisenhower, who supported the idea of National Veterans Day. Weeks led the first national celebration in 1947 in Alabama and annually until his death in 1985. President Reagan honored Weeks at The White House with the PresidentialCitizenship Medal in 1982 as the driving force for the national holiday. Elizabeth Dole, who prepared the briefing for President Reagan, determined Weeks as the "Father of Veterans Day." U.S. Representative Ed Rees from Emporia, Kansas, presented a bill establishing the holiday through Congress. President Dwight Eisenhower, also from Kansas, signed the bill into law on May 26, 1954.

Congress amended this act on June 1, 1954, replacing "Armistice" with "Veterans," and it has been known as Veterans Day since. Remember to fly the American flag on Veterans Day, Thursday, November 11 to honor Americans who served our country.




A motion to adjourn the meeting was made, seconded and approved.

To whom it may concern,

The NYPD 1013 Club of Charlotte, NC is an IRS not for profit 501 (c) (7) organization, Tax ID #45 0557805, comprised of 434 retired and active law enforcement officers, predominately from the NYPD and 57 other law enforcement agencies.

One of the objectives of the Club is to encourage charitable activities among the membership.

On Monday, May 16, 2022 the Club is sponsoring the eighth annual Jimmy LaRossa Memorial Golf Tournament. Jimmy LaRossa, who was a member of our Club was murdered on April 10, 2012.

Gentlemen,

I have the following information regarding adding providers to the Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina Emblem Health in network medical panels.

We are pleased to announce, the process for GHI non-Medicare retirees nominating doctors with the intention of being added as CBP participating providers, has been restored as of today.

EmblemHealth's Customer Service, Provider Network and Grievance & Appeals advocates (representatives) have been informed that the network is in fact, open for provider nominations; letters will no longer state the network is closed.

Members who wish to nominate their provider may contact EmblemHealth via telephone or email. If an Emblem advocate receives a call from a CNY PPO (GHI) Retiree member requesting information on how to nominate their provider for participation, advocates will:

 - o If the request has incomplete provider information, a reply will be emailed to the member requesting the additional information • Advocates will not send a letter to a CNY Retiree member indicating that their network is closed



NATIONAL NYCPD 10-13 ORG. NYPD ID CARD RENEWAL

For those members that reside locally, the ID Card Section (646-610-5150) is now on 2nd floor at 1PP, opposite the Operations Unit.

They will only renew a retiree ID card that has less than 3 months before expiration date or already expired

Please do not go at the end of month due to numerous active MOS retiring and it is very crowded.

Using the above number, call beforehand to make sure there is no promotion on the day you are going because it can get crowded and active will have priority.

For those out of state members, please follow the instructions when mailing in ID cards. I have received ID cards mailed to me using regular first-class mail. The issue with this is that it is not tracked and, therefore, not guaranteed that I will receive it. The Priority Mail procedure provides a tracking number so that the ID card can be accounted for throughout the entire mailing process.

If your ID card is lost or stolen, you must make a police report with your local precinct or PD for lost or stolen property and a copy of the report must accompany the ID card application. **The application will not be processed without a report**.

The NYPD card section uses the photo that is in their system since November of 2002. If your ID card was issued prior to this period, you will have to appear at the ID Card Section in person to take a new photo. You cannot send in a passport photo or a jpeg file photo to update the picture.

ONLY cards issued after November 1, 2002, can be renewed this way. In all other circumstances, members will have to personally visit 1 P.P.

Regarding HR218/LEOSA qualifications: If your ID card does not have an expiration date, it does qualify as a valid ID card under the provisions of the laws. Unless you want to get a current photo on your ID card, you are not required to do so in order to satisfy the qualification. Also remember that some PDs in North Carolina that do the qualifications will require a current ID card so make sure that you check your expiration dates.

A completed PD form **MUST** accompany the card. The form can be downloaded from the National website; <u>https://www.nationalnycpd10-13.org/</u>

Additionally, ID card expiration dates will be increased from 5 to 8 years.

If your card has no expiration date, you do not need to have a new card issued. Your card is perpetually current. Keep it.

THE NATIONAL IS AUTHORIZED TO DELIVER MEMBERS CARDS TO 1 P.P. AND RETURN SAME TO THE MEMBER.


To insure security in the transfer of cards to and from our members the following procedure **MUST** be adhered to:

F.A.Q.

My ID Card was issued before November 2002. Why can't I have it renewed via proxy?

Prior to November 1, 2002 cards were not digital. Consequently the photo cannot be reproduced.

My card has no expiration date. Do I need to have a new card issued?

Definitely not. If you have no expiration date your card is perpetually current. Keep it.

***** Please note: To make things easier for Frank Martarella, our Club will be collecting ID cards quarterly in January, Apr., July & October and mailing them to him. The club will also pay for the postage..

There is a new procedure for pre-merger Transit and Housing Police retirees.

The below information was received in an email from the NYCPD Transit Bureau Personnel Unit and has been verified.

Renewal of Transit ID card that is expired or nearing expiration.

For the retirees that live out of state, they can email a copy of their driver's license and id card and in the body of the email they can put their name, address and a phone number where they can be reached. We run a background check to make sure no one is wanted (you'd be surprised).

Also they need to attach a digital photo of themselves from the waist up in front of a neutral colored wall (please no hats or sunglasses).

We need a digital photo, not a photo of a photo, to put on a new id card that we mail certified.

Please tell your members they can call the Personnel Unit at 1-718-610-4660 and we will be more than happy to walk them thru the process.

Be well and keep collecting those retirement checks.



POLICE UNIONS: NYPD HAS NO PLAN FOR VAX MANDATE CHAOS 10,000 COPS SET TO BE PULLED FROM STREETS

With less than 48 hours left until Mayor de Blasio's arbitrary vaccination deadline for city workers – and following a state judge's refusal to pause the deadline despite the mandate's chaotic rollout – police union leaders are warning New Yorkers that the NYPD brass is completely unprepared for the staffing shortage that will result from the mandate's haphazard implementation.

As of Thursday morning, there were approximately 10,000 unvaccinated, uniformed NYPD members – which equals the staffing of dozens of patrol precincts – who will be barred from reporting for duty on Monday, Nov. 1, unless they have applied for a religious or medical exemption.

The NYPD has yet to announce any detailed plans to address the possible staffing shortage, and it still hasn't published its own policies to implement the mandate. In avideo message to NYPD members yesterday, Police Commissioner Dermot Shea admitted that many practical questions remain unanswered, even though it has been more than a week since Mayor de Blasio announced the mandate and more than a month since Commissioner Shea publicly threw his support behind the mandate.

"I can't tell you what rules don't exist yet," **Shea told members two days before the deadline**, "so I don't want to give you bad information."

PBA President Patrick J. Lynch: "New York City cannot afford to have a police department that is weak, disorganized and totally dominated by the irrational whims of City Hall. Unfortunately, that's what the NYPD has become. Commissioner Shea and his team should have told the Mayor that this mandate and his arbitrary Friday deadline were going to throw NYPD operations into chaos. Instead, they froze like deer in headlights. Now cops and New Yorkers are all wondering: what exactly will happen with the vaccine deadline strikes?"

Detectives' Endowment Association President Paul DiGiacomo said: "While New York City is in the middle of a crime crisis, Mayor de Blasio wants to sideline hundreds of Detectives just to play politics. Our Detectives already worked selflessly through 2020, during the height of the pandemic when there was no vaccine. Now the Mayor shows his thanks by wanting to sideline thousands of cops when we know the testing program was working. Our members are needed to investigate the most heinous of crimes. City Hall will once again turn its back on crime victims as investigations will ultimately be stalled and violent offenders will go free. There is no need for this. The COVID testing program was working. The Mayor's vaccine mandate is needless, self-serving and politically motivated."

Sergeants Benevolent Association President Vincent Vallelong said: "New Yorkers need to wake up. Mayor de Blasio's mandate is 'Defund the Police' in disguise. Criminals know this, and they will take full advantage of the situation to create chaos on our streets."

Lieutenants Benevolent Association President Lou Turco said: "Our members feel like City Hall is intentionally keeping them in the dark. The vaccine-or-test policy has been working, and we've been given no explanation as to why it was scrapped. Nor are there any clear guidelines on what exactly happens to members who are placed on unpaid leave. Many members believe Mayor de Blasio is creating chaos on purpose to coerce them into getting the shot."

Captains Endowment Association President Chris Monahan said: "This situation is a failure of leadership. Our members don't have the information they need to keep their commands running after the deadline hits. When we ask top NYPD executives for that information, they point the finger at the de Blasio administration. The NYPD needs to be run out of 1PP, not City Hall."



MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN UPDATE 10/22/21

- On Thursday October 21, 2021, a New York State Supreme Court judge placed a stay on the rollout of the cities new Medicare Advantage Plus Plan. Ordering the city to "maintain the retirees current health care plans".
- Judge Lyle Frank called the rollout of the plan "irrational"
- This stay order **upholds the existing contract** between the Alliance and the city of New York to implement the new Medicare Advantage plan at a future date.
- The injunction delays the rollout of the plan in an effort to provide more public information surrounding the plan, specifically which health care providers will accept the new plan.
- Judge Frank ordered the city to submit a plan for "curing the deficiencies".
- No timeline has been given as to when the rollout will continue.
- Retirees should await an official announcement from the city or the Alliance as to a change in an opt-out date.

Vaccines

As you are aware the Mayor has announced mandatory vaccines for all New York City employees. The CEA believes each member has a right to an individual choice to receive one or not. The CEA has believed that the manner this mandate was announced and the limited time frame to make an individual decision was deplorable. We have filed an improper practice to address these issues. During the past week we have had many conversations with the department and the City in an attempt to delay or change this policy since we exhausted all legal avenues.

If you choose to retire and do not want to be placed on unpaid leave YOU MUST file with pension today.

If you are awaiting a medical or religious exemption, out sick or on approved leave and plan on retiring you DO NOT have to file for retirement today. You can file for retirement when the request is denied or when your leave ends.

If any CEA member decides not to be vaccinated and the City puts you on unpaid leave the CEA is planning to exercise our collective bargaining right to negotiate the terms with the City. In addition, unpaid leave status does not prevent a member from retiring while on leave.

Uniform Check

I am happy to inform you that as the result of prolonged negotiations with the City of New York, the Captains Endowment Association has secured a mechanism to now make the annual Uniform Allowance tax free. Based on current tax law and in agreement with the City of New York, all members qualify to have their annual dues payments or other qualifying expenses to offset the taxes associated with the Uniform Allowance. All union members will now be entitled to the entirety of the \$980 Uniform Allowance "Tax Free". This check will now be issued/processed by the CEA, not the City of New York.

A follow up email with instructions of how to access and prepare the Uniform Allowance Form will be sent out to all members on Wednesday, November 3^{rd.}

Police Unions Plan To Quit City Coalition For Pension Investments Union Leaders Say Returns Disappointing; Insider Cites Other Factors

The city's police unions have voted to end the participation of the Police Pension Fund in a joint investment arrangement with the four other city funds launched six years ago by City Comptroller Scott Stringer, with one union leader saying that the returns had been disappointing, even as Mr. Stringer contended the systems as a whole had benefited.

He created the Common Investment Meeting in 2015, saying it would consolidate operations by ending the practice of holding separate monthly meetings between his office and the five funds while also improving the return on investments for all of them.

Not Better for Cops' Fund?

When the Daily News broke the story in mid-September of the police unions' decision to leave the consortium, Mr. Stringer said the joint operation had been a success, noting the rate of return for the five funds had been 11.58 percent in the first five years of the pilot program, compared to 7.02 percent over the previous five years when they were making separate investments.

But Detectives' Endowment Association President Paul DiGiacomo said in an Oct. 5 interview that while the return cited by Mr. Stringer might have been better for the five funds collectively, "We get more of a return on our own than we had in this program. We were higher than 20 percent at times when the Police Pension Fund was acting on its own. While you can't predict what it would have been these last few years, based on our prior experience, we feel we might have done better continuing on our own."

One problem with the joint venture, he said, was that "you get sort of lost when you're just one of five funds, and there are others that are much bigger than us," referring to the New York City Employees' Retirement System and the Teachers' Retirement System. The Comptroller's Bureau of Asset Management lists the Police Pension Fund's assets at \$46.2 billion, compared to TRS's \$91.4 billion and the \$77.4 billion in NYCERS.

Shared by Other Unions

Mr. DiGiacomo said the other union trustees of the Police Pension Fund had "the same concerns." The Police Benevolent Association, which has by far the most members in the system, has three votes on the fund's board, with the representatives of the DEA and the unions representing Sergeants, Lieutenants and those in the ranks of Captain and higher each casting a half-vote.

The Comptroller, the Mayor, the Police Commissioner and the city Finance Commissioner each have 1.5 votes on the board.

PBA President Patrick J. Lynch responded to questions about the decision with a statement saying "we are focused on the unique situation of the Fund and the unique needs of its members. We were invited to participate in the common investment meeting on a trial basis. Based on that trial, we have determined that the current format is not the most efficient or effective way to address our members' needs. We look forward to continuing to work with both the current Comptroller and the next one to provide the best possible stewardship of our members' funds."

The police unions have had an uneasy relationship with Mr. Stringer since he sided with the Defund the Police movement last year as anger over George Floyd's death at the knee of a Minneapolis cop led to pressure here to sharply cut the Police Department's budget. When Mayor de Blasio and the City Council slightly more than 15 months ago cut the spending allocation for the NYPD by what they claimed was \$1 billion—just one-third of what the protesters had demanded—Mr. Stringer asserted they had exaggerated the amount cut by roughly \$240 million, further antagonizing the unions.

Less Enthused by Lander

The man expected to succeed Mr. Stringer, Democratic nominee for Comptroller Brad Lander, as a City Councilman has been an outspoken critic of the NYPD for the past decade and a supporter of the defund effort.

But one insider familiar with the discussions that culminated in the police-union withdrawal of support for the CIM said that distaste for the politics of Comptrollers, like unhappiness with collective bargaining or disability-pension denials for union members, typically did not influence pension-investment decisions.

Speaking conditioned on anonymity, this insider said that while those matters "are contentious by nature, pensions should not be, because all sides should have the same goal: protecting and growing the pension investments."

He said that the Board of Education Retirement System, which oversees the pensions of non-Teachers in the Department of Education, used its own investment team rather than relying on the Comptroller's advisers, and had not only the best returns but was the best-funded of the five systems. While it was fully funded, he said, the five funds as a whole had a 60-percent funded rate, about 20 points below what is considered desirable.

Ignored by BAM?

The insider said it was his understanding that Mr. Stringer's Bureau of Asset Management hadn't been sufficiently responsive to a number of union representatives of the pension funds, not just those from the police unions. Such behavior might have been considered "tolerable if their performance was fantastic, but they have significantly underperformed their peers," he contended.

He added, "I believe the police are leaving the CIM because they think the system is broken, and could be fixed with some cooperation and communication."

Mr. Stringer last month urged Mr. Lynch to reconsider the decision to withdraw, saying in a statement to The News, "The men and women of the NYPD and their families deserve a secure retirement. It defies all logic and reason that certain police trustees want to pull out of a system that has made money for their members."

Dear Fellow Sergeant,

For those members on Medicare or approaching Medicare eligibility, the SBA has been aggressively seeking answers to many questions and concerns regarding the NYC Medicare Advantage Plus Plan. Please read the following important update:

Hon Lyle E. Frank, the Justice overseeing the Medicare Advantage Litigation, returned with a "Decision + Order on Motion" concerning the multiple complaints filed in response to implementation of the new NYC Medicare Advantage Plus Plan.

The case combined multiple complaints, against the NYC Office of Labor Relations (OLR), launched by Aetna, United Healthcare and the NYC Organization of Public Service Retirees, an independent retiree group created to represent the interests and rights of retirees.

It has been determined by the courts that the Aetna and United Healthcare complaints against the Medicare Advantage Request for Proposal (RFP) processes and results were unfounded. The RFP does not have to be redone or the results reevaluated.

That said in a show of support and concern the court determined, in their decision, that the <u>NYC Organization of Public Ser-</u> <u>vice Retirees</u> complaint against the Medicare Advantage Plus Plan implementation was founded and the adverse impact it has on current retirees was upheld. Implementation of the plan and the "opt out deadline" October 31, 2021 has therefore been suspended pending court review of the plan, court evaluation of the capability and readiness of the new provider, The Alliance, and a review that the new plan operates to the benefit of NYC retirees.

The Sergeants Benevolent Association (SBA) voted against the NYC Medicare Advantage Plus Plan and thankfully our concerns have been confirmed by the courts and acted on therein. This plan, as it exists today, impacts negatively on our retiree population on multiple fronts and its delay allows for us and advocates like the NYC Organization of Public Service Retirees to address those areas that create the greatest disruptions.

The unreasonable rushing of plan implementation was so flawed that even the **Municipal Labor Committee (MLC)**, the labor group directly responsible for imposing this Medicare Advantage Plan on our members, now recognizes the critical failings that were detrimental to plan participants health and safety.

October 21, 2021 Municipal Labor Committee Re: MA Litigation Update Communication

"The Court seems particularly concerned with the Alliance acknowledging that it is still in the process of discussing with doctors their participation (even though they assured us it was required by contract). "

"The Judge directed the City (and presumably the Alliance) to submit a plan for his review so that the Court is satisfied that retirees can make an informed decision. We were already in discussions with the City and the Alliance about pushing out the Oct. 31 date given comments made by the Judge during argument and that will now be required."

It is important affected members recognize this is a postponement and not a termination of the Medicare Advantage Plus Plan implementation. Members are encouraged to use this time to carefully review the impact of this change on themselves and their families. The SBA will continue to advocate for our members and is always available to answer member questions or address concerns.





The handbook contains information of all of the medical coverage provided to NYC employees and retirees covered by GHI Comprehensive Benefits Plan.

Additionally, many members are still unaware of the GHI Catastrophic Coverage provided by the Superior Officers Council, Sergeants Benevolent Association and the Detectives Endowment Association..

This benefit was established to assist members and eligible dependents to defray some of the non-covered medical and surgical expenses incurred for services rendered by non-participating or out-of-net-work providers and to provide coverage for catastrophic illness.

The below information is listed on their respective websites.

SOC

Members must incur out-of-pocket expenses of more than \$4000.00 per year. (Out-of-pocket expenses are those medical and hospital charges that are considered reasonable and customary by GHI and that are not reimbursed by either the City Health Plan or private insurers).

Members must produce a statement of services, explanation of benefits form and cancelled checks for expenses submitted. Reimbursement is based on a contract year (January - Dec.) 100% of GHI reasonable and customary charges based on the current profile.

The maximum lifetime benefit is 2 million dollars.

The SOC provides a self-funded \$1,000 direct reimbursement payable to the member after the member has submitted, qualified paperwork under the GHI Catastrophic Rider outlined above and the member still has a minimum of at least \$4,000.00 of out-of-pocket qualified. The exclusions and restrictions are the same as the requirement for the catastrophic coverage benefit.

For example you may have paid \$10,000 dollars out-of-pocket expenses, but GHI's payment schedule only deems the reasonable and customary payment for the services to be \$6,000 dollars. The Member pays the remaining \$4,000 dollars of the balance and may now be eligible to receive \$1,000 dollars from the SOC Catastrophic Benefit.

The first \$25,000 is covered for Private Duty Nursing care and thereafter 50% of the remainder with a lifetime cap of \$50,000 per person. The cap for in-hospital Mental Health charges is \$10,000 individual lifetime maximum.

SOC – After a \$4000 annual family deductible, GHI pays 100% of reasonable and customary charges based on a current profile with a maximum lifetime payment of \$250,000 per person.

Limitations: The first \$25,000 is covered for private duty nursing care and 50% thereafter of the remainder with a lifetime cap of \$50,000 per person. The cap for in hospital mental health charges is \$10,000 per person.

SBA—Eligibility

SBA members are eligible, as well as spouses/domestic partners and dependent children who are covered under a participating provider organization (PPO) or a point-of service (POS) plan presently being offered by the New York City Employee Health Benefits Program.

Definition of PPO and POS

Participating provider organization (PPO) indemnity plans offer the option to use either a network provider or an out-of-network provider for medical and hospital care. PPO plans contract with health care providers who agree to accept a negotiated payment from the health plan and predetermined co-payments from subscribers as payment in full for a schedule of medical services provided. When the subscriber uses a non-participating provider, the subscriber is subject to deductibles and/or a higher price schedule. GHI/CBP is an example of a PPO.

Point-of-service (POS) plans offer the freedom to use either a network provider or an out-of-network provider for medical and hospital care.

SBA GHI Catastrophic Coverage continued.....

If the subscriber uses a network provider, health care delivery resembles that of a traditional HMO, with prepaid comprehensive coverage and little out-of-pocket costs for services.

When the subscriber uses an out-of-network provider, health care delivery resembles that of an indemnity insurance product, with less comprehensive coverage and subject to deductibles and coinsurance. HIP PRIME POS and U S. Health Care (QPOS) are POS plans.

The SBA H&W Fund catastrophic coverage plan does not cover subscribers of exclusive participating organizations (EPOs) because they do not provide any out of network benefits.

The catastrophic coverage benefit

The benefit pays up to 100 percent of reasonable and customary eligible expenses after a \$2,000 out-of-pocket annual deductible per person has been reached. Eligible out-of-pocket expenses are those SBA H&W Fund medical and hospital expense charges that are considered reasonable and customary by the basic City Health Plan and are not fully reimbursed by the City Health Plan or private group insurers.

Benefit limits and maximums

There is a lifetime maximum benefit of \$250,000 per covered person. Within this lifetime maximum are the following: (1) Mental health in-hospital care of \$10,000.

(2) Required and approved private duty nursing is covered in full for the first unpaid \$25,000 and then at 50 percent for the remainder up to a lifetime maximum of \$50,000.

Services or charges not covered by the catastrophic benefit

In addition the benefit exclusions of the SBA H&W Fund, the catastrophic benefit does not cover outpatient psychiatric care and prescription drug charges. Ineligible charges such as experimental procedures or services not approved by the member's health plan are likewise not covered by this benefit. Medical, surgical and hospital charges incurred for services rendered by non-participating PPO providers or out-of-network POS providers must be approved by the member's health plan.

Submitting an SBA catastrophic benefit claim

Once you have reached the \$2,000 out-of-pocket, per-person annual deductible, obtain and submit the catastrophic claim benefit form to the Fund office for processing. Instructions are printed on the form.

DEA—There are two parts to the DEA Catastrophic coverage. The first part is an extra rider that the DEA purchased through GHI. There is a \$4,000 deductible (retired members) per calendar year.

Claims for non-participating doctors are submitted through GHI for their basic allowance. Because GHI's payment schedule is so low the member always has an out of pocket expense. When the difference between what your doctor's charges and what GHI allows exceeds \$4,000 you may apply for the DEA catastrophic benefit.

For catastrophic medical expenses after your G.H.I. basic refund, the DEA requires an out-of-pocket deductible of \$4,000 per family per calendar year. When G.H.I. original Explanation of Benefit (EOB) statements are submitted to the DEA reflecting the deductible, we will refund \$3,000 of the \$4,000 deductible. All covered expenses i.e., those claims in which GHI has made some level of payment, after the deductible will be processed at a 100% reimbursement level not to exceed \$250,000 lifetime per family. This catastrophic medical benefit applies only to members enrolled in the GHI-CBP program offered through the City of New York Health Benefits office.

There is an additional benefit under the DEA Catastrophic Benefit Program for Retired Members who do not qualify for the Catastrophic benefit described above.

For members who have out of pocket expenses ranging between \$2,000 and \$4,000 in a calendar year, the DEA Health Benefits Fund will reimburse you the amount between \$2,000 and \$4,000. GHI Explanation of Benefits (EOB) statements will be required for submission to the DEA in order to obtain reimbursement. City Coverage for Medicare-Eligible Retirees

In order to maintain maximum health benefits, it is essential that you join Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance) at your local Social Security Office as soon as you are eligible. If you do not join Medicare, you will lose whatever benefits Medicare would have provided.

Medicare Enrollment

You must notify the Health Benefits Program in writing immediately upon receipt of your, or your dependent's, Medicare card by completing the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Application: <u>https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/olr/downloads/pdf/health/med-b-application.pdf</u>

For retirees 65 and older Social Security has sent the IRMA letters indicating your Medicare part B deductions for 2019. When you receive your Medicare reimbursement check in the spring of 2020 you submit that letter, a copy of the 1099 from Social Security and the reimbursement form for any addition money that was withheld. You are also reimbursed for your spouse's Medicare deductions. If you have not filed in the past you can go back and file for up to 3 past years.

Medicare Part B Reimbursement

The City will reimburse retirees and their eligible dependents for Medicare Part B premiums paid, excluding any penalties. You must be receiving a City pension check and be enrolled as the contract holder for City health benefits in order to receive reimbursement for Part B premiums.

For most retirees, the refund is issued automatically by the Health Benefits Program. If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This will be separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you will receive a check in the mail in June.

The reimbursement amount is based on the standard Medicare Part B premiums. If your Medicare Part B reimbursement amount was less than what you paid in Medicare Part B premiums, excluding penalties, you may be eligible for a Medicare Part B Differential reimbursement. To receive the differential reimbursement, please complete the Medicare Part B Differential Request form (below).

If you were eligible for Medicare Part B Reimbursement for prior years but did not enroll by providing a copy of your Medicare card, reimbursement is limited to the previous three (3) calendar years. To enroll, please complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application.

2019 Medicare Part B Premium Reimbursement ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The standard reimbursement amount for Calendar Year 2019 is \$109.00 per person, per month. For those newly enrolled in Medicare in 2019, currently, the standard amount is \$135.50. The reimbursements will be issued in Apr.. If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your Medicare Part B reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This will be a separate payment from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you will receive a check in the mail in Apr..

Question: How do I enroll for the Medicare Part B reimbursement?

Answer: Complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application and return it with a copy of your Medicare card to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit.

Question: I am a City retiree. Is my spouse/domestic partner/Medicare-eligible dependent entitled to the Medicare Part B reimbursement?

Answer: Yes. They are eligible if they are covered under your City health plan and enrolled in Medicare Part B Reimbursement and the health plan has the dependent in Medicare status. Complete the Medicare Part B Reimbursement Program Application and return it with a copy of their Medicare card to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit.

Question: I received the standard premium amount of \$109.00 per month for 2019 for the Medicare Part B reimbursement. However, I paid more than the standard amount. Can I be reimbursed for the difference?

Answer: Yes. If your 2019 monthly Medicare Part B premium was between \$110.00 and \$135.50, you may be eligible for an additional reimbursement amount referred to as a differential payment. In order to receive the differential payment, the retiree and/or dependent must submit a copy of proof of this additional payment (for example, the Form SSA-1099, bank statements, CMS-500 Notice of Medicare Payment Due) to our office for review. If approved, you will receive the differential payment during the first quarter of 2021. For further information and to download the Medicare Part B Differential Request form, visit our website at nyc.gov/hbp.

If, however, you are enrolled in Medicare Part B as of 2016, you should have received reimbursement of \$135.50 per month automatically and no action will be required on your part.

Question: Many people received their reimbursement and I didn't get mine yet. What should I do?

Answer: Medicare reimbursements were deposited directly into the same account that you use for your pension payment. Please check your bank statement.

Question: I don't have direct deposit for my pension payment and still have not received my Medicare reimbursement. What should I do? Answer: You should write to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Please include your name, retiree spouse's name (if applicable) retiree's Social Security number, agency from which the retiree retired, current address, telephone number, and a copy of your Medicare card/ your spouse's Medicare card (if applicable). This review process may take up to 8 weeks from receipt of the above information. Question: The reimbursement I received is not the correct amount. What should I do?

Answer: You should write to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Include your name, Social Security number, current address and telephone number, and a copy of your Medicare card. State the reason you believe the amount is incorrect. This process may take up to 8 weeks from receipt of the information.

Question: The check that I received is torn/ripped and the bank will not cash it. What should I do?

Answer: You should return the check to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Include your name and Social Security number. It may take up to 8 weeks for a replacement check to be issued.

Question: I am the retiree and received a reimbursement for my spouse/domestic partner/Medicare- eligible dependent who died during the reimbursement year. What should I do?

Answer: Contact the Health Benefits Program in writing. Include both the retiree's and deceased individual's name, both Social Security numbers, address, phone number and a copy of the death certificate. Mail the information to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit.

Question: My spouse/dependent was a City retiree who died before the reimbursements were issued. How do I claim the reimbursement?

Answer: You should write to the address listed above, Attention: Medicare Unit. Include the retiree's name and Social Security number, your name, your address, phone number and a copy of the death certificate. Upon receipt of the death certificate, we will contact you if further documentation is required.

Question: Do I have to re-enroll every year for the Medicare Part B Reimbursement?

Answer: No, but if you change your address, or if one of the eligible Medicare Part B recipients dies, you must notify the Health Benefits Program, in writing.

Question: What if my bank account information changes?

Answer: Please notify your pension system directly of any bank account changes. The changes will be automatically used for the Medicare Part B reimbursements.

Question: I paid more than the standard premium for Medicare Part B. Am I entitled to the higher premium reimbursement (IRMAA)?

Answer: You may be entitled to the higher reimbursement through Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA). Vist our website at nyc.gov/hbp for further information.

IRMAA Medicare Part B Reimbursement

If you paid more than the standard monthly reimbursement rate for Medicare Part B, as an Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA), you may be eligible for additional reimbursement. If you submit the required documentation for Medicare Part B IRMAA reimbursement, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account.

If your permit was issued before January 15, 2013, the deadline to submit your recertification was January 31, 2018. If your permit was issued on or after January 15, 2013, the deadline to recertify is five years after the date the permit was issued. As a permit holder, it is your responsibility to recertify your permit whether you receive a notification letter or not.

IF A MEMBER DIES - INFORMATION TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OR FAMILY

(Hopefully Not Needed For A Long Time)

Too often spouses and families are left in a quandary upon the death of a loved one. Few situations in life are more stressful than when a spouse passes. All too often we have a difficult time focusing on the issues at hand and need guidance to get the deceased affairs in order. The following is a general guide for the widow(er) or the decease's family regarding important notifications that must be made by the surviving spouse and information you should have on hand when a retiree dies.

I. PREPARATIONS BEFOREHAND

- GATHER ASSETS This doesn't mean piling them all together. It means getting a list of all the assets at the time of the decedent's death, along with copies of statements, deeds, etc. This information is needed for probate. It's also essential for filing federal and state estate tax returns, if required.
- REVIEW IRAs If the surviving spouse is the beneficiary, decide whether to roll an IRA over to the surviving spouse.
- GET GOOD ADVICE and get it now. The money you pay to attorneys and other advisers to resolve issues NOW can be much lower than if you deal with problems AFTER a person's death.
- In case of couples, usually MOSt of the property is held in joint names and the survivor obtains same "by operation of law". However, there may be some items which were held in the name of the deceased only, and in that case it would be necessary to go to Probate Court to transfer ownership of that property, unless listed in a trust.
- GET ORGANIZED NOW When someone dies, one of the big problems for beneficiaries is locating the things necessary to settle the estate. Make sure you know before the death occurs where to find the following documents and information. (This is just a partial list)
 - 1. Will
 - 2. Living Will
 - 3. Trust
 - 4. Deeds (if any).
 - 5. Safe-deposit boxes (location of boxes, contents and keys).
 - 6. Life insurance policies.
 - 7. Funeral and burial instructions.
 - 8. Names and addresses of creditors and debtors.
 - 9. List of assets and where they are located.
 - 10. List of all advisers (attorney, accountant, insurance agent, stockbroker, etc.).

II. STEPS TO BE TAKEN AFTER DEATH - Notifications to be made:

Contact the appropriate Union for a possible existing life insurance policy and also for continuation of optional benefits, if qualified.

- 2. Contact the NYC Health Benefits Program for Special Continuation of Coverage application (coverage for life) located at 40 Rector Street, 3rd Floor, New York 10006 (212) 513-0470.
- 3. Contact the NYPD Operations Unit located at One Police Plaza at (646) 610-5580, for pall bearers (Funeral Director will usually do this for you) for all five boroughs, all of Long Island and Upstate New York, but not beyond Dutchess County.
- 4. Contact Social Security: (800) 772-1213 (Funeral Director will usually do this for you).
- 5. Contact Fraternal Organizations to arrange for visitors, Color Guard and possible insurance benefits.

6. If a veteran, notify the Veterans Administration at (800) 827-1000 for: Grave marker, Funeral Allowance and Flag (Funeral Director will usually do this for you). If can't find discharge papers or DD 214, you will need date of Enlistment, date of Discharge, Branch & Serial Number. If deceased had 100% disability for 10 years, spouse is entitled to an additional benefit.

7. Notify your Church or Temple for announcements. (Funeral Director will usually do this for you).

8. Health Insurance: COBRA (Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985) COBRA has a safety net. If spouse or dependent was covered under deceased's health plan they may continue coverage under COBRA for up to 36 months. New York State in 2001 amended the Administrative Code to continue Health Care Coverage for Surviving Spouses for Life (Download Information Regarding this Amendment). This enables the deceased's spouse and/or dependents to receive coverage at the group rate. The City and the Line Organization health benefits stop at the death of the members. The rate, though high, is cheaper than the non group rate. Call: NYC Employee Benefits (212) 513-0470

THIS INFORMATION PERTAINS TO COBRA

Police Officers & Firefighter surviving spouses are to follow this procedure

Attach a machine copy of the death certificate to a request for an application for COBRA FOR LIFE and send it to: Retired Employees Benefits Section

Att: Linda Harris (Cobra for Life) 40 – Rector Street – 3rd Floor New York, NY 10006

They will send the surviving spouse a <u>pre-numbered application</u> allowing the spouse to continue the health coverage the member had at a cost equal to 102% of what the City pays, which includes administrative fees. This is fairly reasonable. <u>Ap-plying for this must be done within 30 days</u>. Benefits are retroactive if the surviving spouse requires medical attention during this interim period.

At this time if a member and spouse are of Medicare age, and reside in an area covered by Aetna, I would strongly recommend they choose that plan over GHI/EBC/CBP.

Also, they would need to consider the respective union plans as those plans would only be available for 36 months, and whether the health plan rider would be a better choice.

THINGS YOU WILL NEED

DEATH CERTIFICATES - Death Certificates are necessary in every step to the successful administration of a decedent's estate. (Usually Funeral will obtain certificates as part of his service at current cost). They are usually needed for:

Pension Bureau

Veterans Administration (if a veteran)

Motor Vehicle Bureau if auto was in deceased's name. 1 for each insurance policy.

Court (If probate is needed).

Your State Department of Revenue to obtain non-tax certificate if real property is involved.

Bank accounts held in Trust for another 1 for each account if property held in a Trust.

Personal Records.

Note: If estate is probated, some of the above will take a Letter Testamentary instead of a Death Certificate.

MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE (With Official Raised Seal):

Social Security, (not necessary if surviving spouse already receiving benefits) Veterans Administration, if a veteran.

LETTERS TESTAMENTARY or LETTERS OF ADMINISTRATION: Motor Vehicle Bureau, if auto is in the deceased's name. One for each bank account Brokerage house account (share of stock or bonds, etc. that were in the deceased's name alone)

DISCHARGE PAPERS: DD 214 - (Original needed) Social Security, if spouse was not already receiving benefits. Remember that service time counts toward qualification. They will Photostat. Veterans Administration, if a veteran

PAID FUNERAL BILLS:

1 copy for Pension Bureau

1 copy for Probate Court

1 copy for IRS, if taxable estate.

OTHER THINGS THAT MAY APPLY (usually after burial)

Cancel any leases. (If your parent or loved one rented a home, cancel the lease after clearing out the furnishings) Inform insurance companies.

File life insurance claims for any policies on the person's life, and request that the insurers send you Form 712, Life Insurance Statement (this is a statement about the life insurance that must be filed with the estate tax return). Make sure the car insurance company continues to cover the person's car until it's sold or transferred to a beneficiary.

Make sure the homeowners policy continues to provide adequate coverage for the person's things until removed from the home.

Notify companies the person did business with.

Cancel credit cards, and close charge accounts.

Have airlines to transfer frequent-flier miles to the primary beneficiary. (Each airline has different policy concerning this issue. Check with carrier about rules)

Consideration should also be given to making pre-death funeral arrangements. This provision, no matter how painful, should be discussed by couples and by parents with their families. Too often, spouse and children spend much too much money on a funeral and do so without really knowing what were the deceased's wishes in this regard (Place of burial, Cremation, etc.)

Consideration should also be given to having a "Family Durable Power of Attorney" (Someone to take over your finances if you become incapacitated or incompetent)

There are no words of comfort at such a difficult time, however, if you have all the necessary information at the ready it will expedite any claim that is pending, make the process run smoothly, and your stress level can be minimized.



When cops were robbers: the early days of the NYPD



William Devery, the first police commissioner of New York, made enough in bribes to buy the Yankees.

The NYPD's First Fifty Years Politicians, Police Commissioners, & Patrolmen by Bernard Whalen and Jon Whalen

They were the city's finest — and sometimes, the city's most notorious.

"The NYPD's First Fifty Years," by Bernard Whalen and Jon Whalen chronicles the early arc of the police department following its formation in 1898, when 18 independent forces became one.

Some of the 21 men who ruled the NYPD through its first half-century were forward-thinking visionaries. Some were pragmatic administrators. But more than a few, the authors note, tried their hand at larceny, or at least dereliction of duty. They include:

William Devery (1898-1901)

The department's first chief of police, a rank that was abolished in 1901 for that of police commissioner, was the king of kickbacks.

At age 24, Devery quit a bartending job to join the Metropolitan Police Force, the forerunner of the NYPD. Scoring a seat to take the police entrance exam required a \$300 under-the-table payoff while to "advance in rank required payments ranging from \$1,000 (to make sergeant) to \$2,000 (to become a captain), even when a candidate had passed the written test with high marks." (Consider that in 1918 — 40 years after Devery first joined the department — the starting salary of a patrolman was still only \$1,200 annually!)

"Devery was more than willing to trade dollars for rank because he knew that once he became a precinct commander, he could easily recover his 'fees,' " the authors write.

Earlier in his career, upon taking command of a Lower East Side police precinct, Devery was heard to say: "They tell me there's a lot of grafting going on in this precinct. They tell me you fellows are the fiercest ever on graft. Now that's going to stop! If there's any grafting to be done, I'll do it. Leave it to me."

Devery, courtesy of the loot he hornswoggled, was able to buy the New York Highlanders, the forerunner of the New York Yankees that he and a partner sold for \$300,000 in 1915. No wonder journalist Lincoln Steffens said of him: "As Chief of Police he is a disgrace, but as a character he is a work of art."

Theodore Bingham (1906-1909)



What shall we make of hard-charging Bingham, except that he would have been decidedly ill-suited to Twitter, had the social-media tool been around 110 years ago?

A former brigadier general who lost his left leg during an Army engineering accident in Buffalo, also was afflicted with pathological bluntness.

Bingham lobbied early in his tenure for the right to promote or demote police inspectors, a rank that carried certain civil-service protections. When a new law passed giving him the very authority he sought, Bingham was hardly mollified, insisting in an April 1908 speech that his department was still hobbled because captains were able to retain the same job protections inspectors had just lost.

"I wish that about 40 police captains would die overnight. They are no good," he announced.

He apologized, but that September he was at it again.

This time, an article he wrote appeared that stated how "half the criminals in the city were Russian Jews, and the worst offenders were their Hebrew sons, whom he described as natural pickpockets," the authors note.

The querulous Bingham apologized anew, but his tactlessness became an issue once more when he indiscreetly volunteered a clue on the whereabouts of Lt. Joseph Petrosino, the department's first true media darling.

Petrosino was already famous for his heroic battles against the Black Hand, a nefarious gang and precursor to the Mafia that preyed on Italian businessmen with extortions, kidnappings and bombings.

In early 1909, the lieutenant embarked on a confidential mission to Italy, seeking criminal background records of Black Hand members operating in the Big Apple.

When asked about Petrosino's whereabouts, Bingham blurted out, "Why he may be on the ocean bound for Europe for all I know."

The intemperate quip — what the authors deem "this foolish slip of the tongue"— was credited with enabling reporters to learn that Petrosino had arrived in Italy. It is perhaps no wonder, then, that on the evening of March 12, he was shot dead, outside a Palermo cafe.

The case was never solved.

Many blamed Bingham's garrulousness for what befell Petrosino, but the brusque commissioner was somehow able to weather that storm — at least for 10 more weeks, until his final act of impertinence did him in, at last. He wrote an angry letter to Mayor George B. McClellan Jr., refusing to take the blame for problems with his department. McClellan fired him for "insubordination."

Richard Enright (1918-1925)



Richard Enright (meeting with a squad of women tasked to ferret out subway gropers in 1923) discovered that 30 members of the NYPD were also members of the Ku Klux Klan, but he did nothing.

There is an enduring NYPD maxim that has long circulated within the corridors of power within police headquarters: "Big cases, big problems. Small cases, small problems. No cases, no problems."

The wisdom of this old chestnut was proven in the immediate aftermath of an embarrassing November 1922 front-page story in the New York World detailing how a Baptist minister in Brooklyn let the Ku Klux Klan recruit from among his parishioners.

Aghast at the news, Mayor John Francis Hylan demanded that Police Commissioner Enright follow up on that disturbing news.

"Ferret out those despicable, disloyal persons who are attempting to organize a society the aims and purposes of which are of such character that were they to prevail, the foundation of our country would be destroyed. Go after the Ku Klux Klan and do not let them get a foothold in New York City," Hylan thundered.

Problem was, the authors note, the Klan already had a foothold here, as was demonstrated when, three weeks after Hylan's admonition, Enright dutifully turned over a list to the Brooklyn DA containing an astonishing 800 suspected Klansmen who were living here. That wasn't the worst of it, though.

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Thirty of those names, Enright discovered, were NYPD cops. No one on the master list had broken any laws, so a decision was reached on exactly what to do: nothing.

Joseph Warren (1927-1928)

Warren's dereliction is best illustrated by the murder of Arnold Rothstein, once New York's most notorious gangster.

Rothstein was alleged to have been the brains behind the infamous Black Sox scandal of 1919, in which the World Series was fixed; he was also the real-life embodiment of F. Scott Fitzgerald's unctuous creation, Meyer Wolfsheim, in "The Great Gatsby."

Uncharacteristically, Rothstein lost \$320,000 during a three-day marathon poker game in the early fall of 1928, a debt he apparently found no compunction to promptly honor, as he believed he'd been cheated. Two months later, on Sunday evening, Nov. 3, 1928, Lady Luck dealt him a very bad hand while he was at a floating poker game in room 349 of the Park Central Hotel, at Seventh Avenue and West 55th Street.

A player purportedly accused "The Brain" of being a "welch" for failing to pay his debt, which lead to heated words — and Rothstein being blasted in the gut. He stumbled from the room before being rushed to a local hospital, where he died two days later, without naming his killer.

Suspicions soon fixed on George "Hump" McManus, whose coat was left at the scene.

Police Commissioner Warren — who was legitimately beset by debilitating mental problems — inexplicably permitted his top investigator, Deputy Chief Inspector John Coughlin, commanding officer of the Detective Division, to take "a sudden extended vacation, a move that brought the investigation to a complete halt," the authors note.

Mayor Jimmy Walker used Warren's misstep to recruit a new police commissioner while attempting to ease Warren out, but the damage proved insurmountable. McManus strode from the courthouse a free man.

Lewis Valentine (1934-1945)



Lewis Valentine (right with Mayor Fiorello La Guardia) advised roughing up suspects.

The no-nonsense Valentine was a cop for more than 30 years when Mayor Fiorello La Guardia tapped him as his police commissioner and a fair measure of the Little Flower's future successes can be laid at his doorstep.

They were a strange pairing: La Guardia was a liberal reformer in the socialist mold, while Valentine's political orthodoxy seemed to hew to the right of Attila the Hun.

Valentine, whose autobiography was appropriately enough titled, "Nightstick" and who would later host a radio show, "Gang Busters," was the embodiment of a "tough cop." It was his good fortune to have served when he did, as the worst recent transgressions under the NYPD's stop-and-frisk program pall by comparison to the routine civil-rights abuses Valentine proudly countenanced.

He was, after all, an unapologetic partisan of "the third degree" — the "enhanced interrogation techniques" of the era — where recalcitrant suspects could be relied upon to enthusiastically share their criminal culpability after enduring brutal squad-room beatings. Everyone just winked, save the battered suspects nursing puffy eyes.

Valentine chastised the cops under his command not to coddle criminals and actually expected gangsters to tip their hats to his officers whenever they walked past, promising promotions "for the men who kick those gorillas around."

Following the slow death of a cop who had been shot a week earlier, an already incensed Valentine grew more enraged when he spotted a jaunty-looking hoodlum, Harry Strauss, "wearing a Chesterfield overcoat with a velvet collar and pearl gray fedora cocked atop his head at a wise-guy angle."

"When you meet such men," he lectured his men, "draw quickly and shoot accurately. Look at him. He's the best-dressed man in this room, yet he's never worked a day in his life. When you meet men like this, don't be afraid to muss 'em up. Men like him should be mussed up. Blood should be smeared all over that velvet collar. Instead, he looks as though he has come out of a barber shop."

He wasn't done with his sermon.



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


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
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
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
